CORNING — Through the generosity of Miss Elizabeth A. McNamara, 14 East Fourth Street, new votive lights for St. Anthony's statue have been installed in St. Mary's Church. The Rev. John A. Smith, pastor, has had the gift installed. The candelabrum for the lights contain 52 holders for candles.

The new votive lights are described as latest type of improved lights and works of art. Miss McNamara donated the statue of St. Anthony with the marble pedestal and candelabrum with votive lights in memory of her brother, the late William F. McNamara, attorney of this city, whose death occurred some years ago.

Votive lights before statues of St. Anthony originated in a move to raise funds for bread for the poor, known as St. Anthony's bread. The purpose is perpetuated

throughout the Christian world. Miss McNamara has visited the Shrine of St. Anthony at Padua, Italy, where the Saint's remains repose behind the main altar.

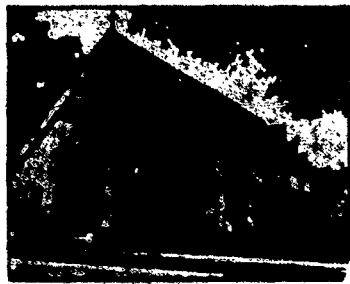
