## MEN IN SERVICE

A large scroll will be prepared shortly containing the names of all the men of the parish who have entered the army. When completed it will be placed in the vestibule of the church to serve as a reminder to those who enter to pray for their welfare. Many names have already been handed in, but not all. Relatives and friends are asked to cooperate by giving the names of these boys at the rectory soon, in order the list may be completed quickly.

Two of the vigil light stands in the sanctuary have been set aside for lights to be burned for the soldiers' intentions. A small American flag on the top of each stand distinguishes them from the others.

The Triduum for victory and peace, requested by Bishop Kearney, in connection with the feast of the Patronage of St. Joseph, is being conducted Wednesday, Thursday and Friday of this week. Services begin each evening at 7:45. A short sermon and Benediction of the Blessed Sacrament

form part of the devotions. On Thursday evening the Triduum will be included as part of the weekly Holy Hour in honor of the Blessed Sacrament.

The boys of the school have begun practice in preparation for the opening of the C. Y. O. Grammar School Football League on May 1. As in past years the school will be represented in the league by a team. When the team rounds into shape and gets more used to playing together, the boys hope to win very many if not all of their games. MILWAUKEE. Corporal Carroll T. Andrews, of the United States Army Air Corps, now director of the choir at the Wheeler Field, Hawaii, chapel and chief clerk in the office of the Rev. Edward Taylor, of the Army Chaplains' Corps, is a graduate of St. Thomas Aquinas High School here and a former member of the choir at Gesù Church.

Long interested in music, Corporal Andrews was specializing in that field at Wisconsin State Teachers' College when he enlisted in the Army Air Corps in September, 1940. He is the son of Mrs. Marie Andrews, of this city.

When the Most Rev. James J. Sweeney was installed as Archbishop of Honolulu, Corporal Andrews was called upon to sing in

the choir for the ceremonies. On his way to Hawaii he had organized a ship's orchestra, and on landing had formed a post office club.

In addition to directing the Wheeler Field chapel choir, he is organist and sacristan and serves the 4:30 Mass daily. In the December 7 attack he suffered an injured wrist.

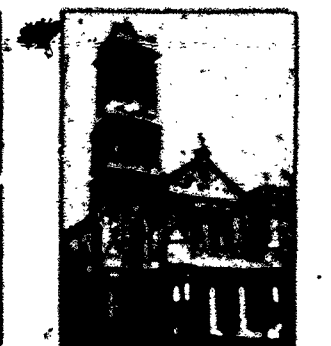
