Saturday, Apr. 25, is the day set for the city-wide collection of scrap metal by the Rochester Salvage Committee, headed by William T. Nolan, Chairman. The metal will be used for military weapons against the Axis.

Attics and cellars should be thoroughly examined for objects with iron, steel, copper, aluminum, brass or lead. **NO TIN IS WANTED IN THIS DRIVE.**

The committee urges having ready for collection the type of articles given here as samples:

Garden tools, metal beds, old stoves, metal ornaments of any type, old heaters or boilers, pots

and pans, iron fencing or railing, drain pipes and gutters, metal roofing.

Large articles such as an iron stove, large hot water tank or other heavy piece of metal will be called for by a special crew of city workmen, employees in the Department of Public Works, if salvage headquarters, Main 1133, is called before Friday noon, this week.

The committee urges "Show Your Metal, Get in the Scrap." Be ready for the collectors who will start a house-to-house collection at 7 A. M. Saturday with the Department of Public Works in charge. Put the metal at the curb for easy pick-up.

Charles Hyland Marks 50 Years As Safe Deposit Attendant

Charles Allen Hyland, veteran 73-year-old vault attendant, celebrated a half century of service, April 17, 1942, with Rochester Trust and Safe Deposit Company, establishing a record seldom equalled in the community.

In a simple ceremony held in the bank, Robert C. Watson, Chairman of the Board of Directors of Rochester Trust (who himself celebrated his fiftieth anniversary with the company in 1939) presented Hyland with an illuminated and bound copy of the Resolutions of the Board of Directors, congratulating him on his fifty years of service, which was accompanied with the gift of a wallet of money.

For thirty-one of his fifty years of service Charles A. Hyland has stood at the massive sliding gate at the entrance to the Safe Deposit Department of Rochester Trust and Safe Deposit Company, a gate which he has opened and closed over a million and a quarter times

in admitting thousands of the city's foremost citizens who maintained private safe deposit boxes in the bank's vaults.

In his half century of service, Charles Hyland has served under five presidents of Rochester Trust: J. Moreau Smith, 1888-1907; V. Moreau Smith, 1907-1913; William C. Barry, Sr., 1913-1918; Robert C. Watson, 1917-1940; George H. Hawks, present president. He has served under three vault superintendents, Austin H. Cole, Arthur E. Albright, and Judson H. Scott.

Of the thousands of customers who have entered the gate at which Charles Hyland has stood guard in the vestibule of the Safe Deposit Department for thirty-one years he can recall by name and identify nearly all who are customers of long standing. To all of them he is known as the genial attendant, ever faithful to his job, quiet, efficient and always at hand when needed.

He resides with his wife and daughter at 95 Lapham Street.

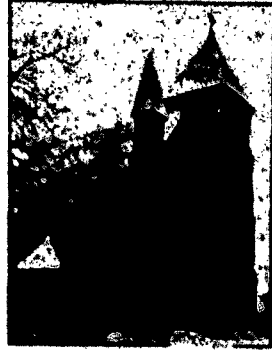

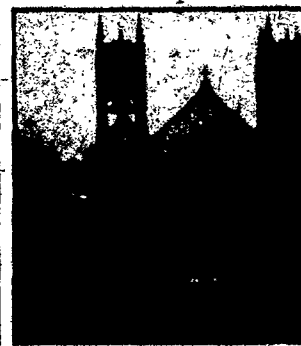
