The Sixth Grade of Corpus Christi School tells us that it "has been working very hard during Lent to ransom a pagan baby. It went over the top and now has enough for TWO ransoms." An Eskimo girl and an Indian boy are their choice, the girl to be named Rose Gertrude and the boy William Joseph after Father William O'Brien who left a short time to take up his duties as Chaplain in the Army.
