LADIES OF CHARITY CARRY ON

The first creation of St. Vincent de Paul's vast genius for charity was the label given to the Ladies of Charity in the year of 1617. Thus Catholic Action, so often labeled a twentieth century development became a reality in France over three hundred years ago. A great social worker planned wisely and well and the result was an organization which is so much a part of our present social work program.

With emphasis on service, the reports of each sub-committee indicate a generous donation of time and effort on the part of each individual Lady of Charity. The Sewing Committee of which Mesdames Glenn R. Weiland and Bertram L. Comstock are Co-Chairmen average about 450 hours of service each month. True to the active participation of the organization in community and national programs, a part of this time was devoted to First Aid and Red Cross. Ever conscious of the needs on the home front, children and adults in our families have been remembered with garments, thoughtfully finished to suit the individual need.

Sew for Red Cross

The Red Cross Committee headed by Mrs. Fred J. Battersby and Miss Eleanor Kelly meet each week. This group is sewing for both the Red Cross and St. Joseph's Hospital. Many additional hours of service are given by members outside of the regular meeting.

Mesdames Ivan F. Brady and Francis Burns report enthusiastically on the progress of the Committee of St. Anne de Beupre. Weekly visits are made to St. Joseph's Hospital by members of this committee. Easter was not just another day for many who were in the hospital that day, because of the sunshine baskets, filled with personal gifts for each patient in the wards. The functions of this committee will be planned to meet the requests of Sister M. Valerian, Superintendent and the Reverend Philip McGhan, Chaplain at the hospital.

Story telling hours are now a part of the day for youthful patients, and birthdays will not be forgotten, when they occur during the hospitalization of some wistful eyed boy or girl. Scrap books are nearing completion and will soon bring joy to many of the children on Sister Maurice's floor. These functions have been assigned to the Committee of the Infant of Prague of which, Miss Florence Kane and Mrs. Edward Dawes are Co-Chairmen.

Given Bishop's Medal

The Committee of our Lady of Good Counsel has registered each Catholic Mother, who is now a patient at St. Joseph's Hospital as an auxiliary member. On the occasion of the first visit to the Maternity Annex, the functions of the committee were explained to each individual mother. Newman Club Formed At U. of Kentucky

LEXINGTON, KY.—A Newman Club of the University of Kentucky has been organized by Very Rev. George J. O'Brien, chaplain of St. Joseph Hospital, Lexington, with the permission of the Most Rev. Francis W. Howard, Bishop of Covington.

For a number of years the Catholic students of the University had had a Catholic Club, organized for the purpose of promoting the spiritual, cultural and social life of the students and safeguarding their faith. This club was converted into a Newman Club by Father O'Brien, who secured membership for the group in the National Federation of Newman Clubs. At present the Lexington club numbers about 50 active members.
