**In A Des Moines Barber Shop**

Barber: "Do you live in Des Moines?"

The problem seems to be—how to keep the farm boys on the farm. I don't think we have to worry about the farm girls, because if we can keep the boys here, the boys, in their turn, will keep the girls there. Whether they are aware of it or not, girls want the kind of husbands (and fathers) farmers make.  
But how keep the farm boys on the farm? Statistics show that most of our farm boys want to be farmers. According to the barber, only after a couple of years in the city do they really know why they wanted to be farmers—no freedom and too many bosses; no independence and too many collectors; not enough sky and too much noise; too many cars and not enough dirt; too much cement under the feet to shut the earth out and too much cement above the head to

hold off the sun.  
Now if most farm boys want to be farmers while they are growing up on the farm, and farm boys grown to manhood in the city, can give half a dozen reasons for wishing they were back on the farm—then why not? I have a suspicion that in line with the Pope's thinking conditions do not permit even the idea of a homestead of their own much less the reality. Money-minded farm fathers are often to blame.  
Up in the North Wisconsin dairy country a young farm boy married a young farm girl recently. They apparently hadn't anything but each other. The respective paternal parents of the couple put their heads together.  
"I say, John, if I give those two kids seven cows, what will you give 'em?"  
"If you can give 'em seven cows, Joe, so can I."  
"Ten more miles into the north they moved with their 14 cows. They are renters now, but in ten years they'll own a farm. I know their kind; they're a sturdy stock. All they need is a little start—ESG."
