Third Order Of St. Francis

The Third Order of St. Francis will hold its April meeting at St. Patrick's Church (the old Cathedral Parish) at 2:30 on Sunday, the 28th. The Rev. Bartholomew O'Brien will conduct the services.

The Franciscan family is large and active in its three orders. Franciscan news is often in the public eye for example, the association with the cause of Kateri Tekakwitha. On the property along the Mohawk River where once was the Indian village of Caughnawaga, there now are located a humble Franciscan Friary and an unpretentious chapel called St. Peter's in memory of an earlier chapel of that name. In the first St. Peter's Chapel on Apr. 18, 1678, an orphan Indian girl was baptized and took the name of Catherine. Her reputation for heroic virtue has won for her the title, "Lily of the Mohawks." For many years, the Franciscan Fathers at Tekakwitha Friary have offered daily special prayers for the canonization of the Indian girl.

The first Catholic mission definitely established in China was that of the Italian Franciscan, John of Montecorvino. Last year, Rev. A. Tchang, O.M.C., a native Chinese Franciscan, undertook the spiritual care of his countrymen held in custody by the Italian civil authority. On July 31, before a large gathering of Franciscan friars and other priests, forty of the hundred entrusted to Friar Anthony's care were baptized, confirmed, and received their first Communion.

Down in North Carolina a Franciscan friar in the humblest of parishes, finds himself suddenly confronted with the task of supplementing regular chaplains of one of the largest training centers in the country. Hundreds of the boys like to leave camp to seek spiritual consolation—and wherever God needs a servant, there is a Franciscan.


