Graduation day will find the Class of '42 attired in summer formal, instead of the customary tuxedos.

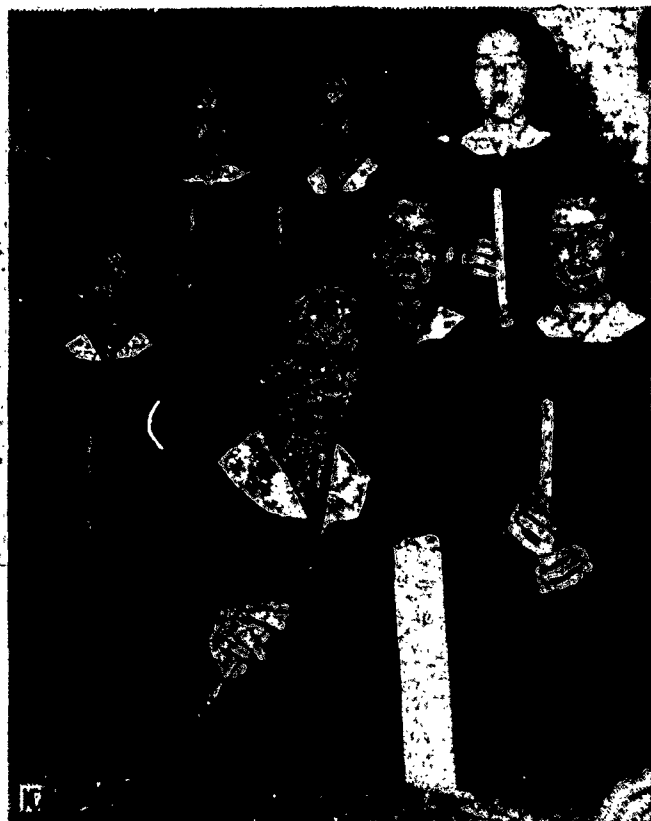
Kraft Appointed Maroon and White Editor
