Music was furnished by a well known orchestra.

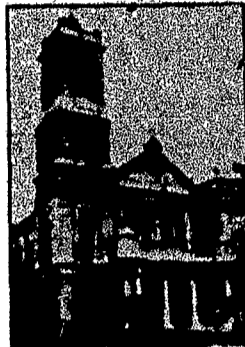
