## J. P. MacSweeney Heads Legal Aid Society 12th Time

At the Annual Meeting of the Directors of the Legal Aid Society held on Monday noon, April 27, Joseph P. MacSweeney was re-elected President for the twelfth successive term. Since his first election to the presidency in 1933, the work of the Society has advanced steadily until now over 3,000 clients are served annually in the City of Rochester. In addition, working relations have been established with the Bar Association, and with the help of volunteers the service now covers the County of Monroe.

This growth proved to be a fortunate saving to the people during the depression, for it was found that for every dollar expended in operating costs, the Society prevented the expenditure of approximately \$3.00 of relief funds. The office is now prepared to take care of the increasing number of war service cases connected with the Soldiers' and Sailors' Civil Relief Act and other legal problems connected with the draft.

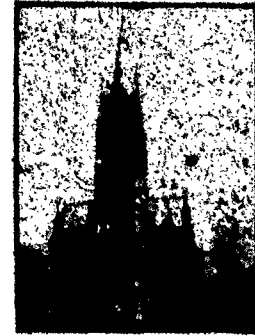

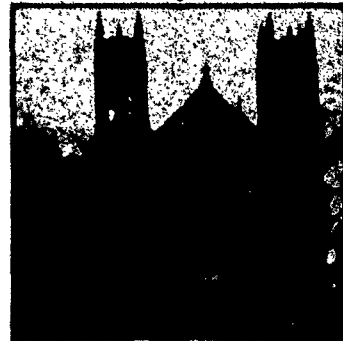

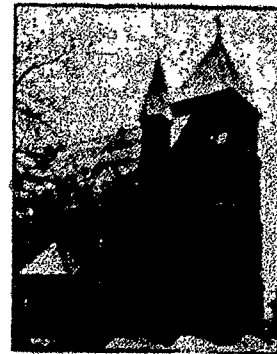
