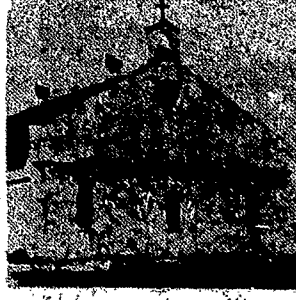

## Sodality Conference Plans May Day Program

BUFFALO. At the Spring convocation of the Western New York Sodality Conference held last Saturday at Canisius College, Buffalo, plans were considered for the annual May Day of the organization which will be held this year on World Sodality Day, May 10, at the National Shrine of Our Lady of Victory, Lackawanna, N. Y., more familiarly known as "Father Baker's."

All members of the Conference will receive Holy Communion in their respective parish churches in the morning and the afternoon exercises will open at 3:00 o'clock in the Basilica—known the world over, with the recitation of the Rosary.

The sermon on the occasion will be given by the Very Rev. Timothy J. Coughlin, S.J., President of Canisius College. The crowning of the Queen of May will be done by Miss Rita Povero, of Nazareth College, vice-president of the conference, and she will be assisted by the prefects of the various schools in the union, who will act as Maids of Honor to Miss Povero.

The first pilgrimage of the Sodality Conference fifteen years ago was made to Father Baker's shrine and the records show that the Padre of the Poor preached an unusually eloquent sermon on that occasion. It was with the utmost joy that the Sodality received the word that they would return again to this famous shrine but this time with circumstances quite different from the last time they assembled there.

A feature of this year's May Day will be the special prayers for those in the armed forces. In particular, they will pray for all those who at one time were members of the Conference. The names of all the relatives and close friends of the members of the conference will be collected by the secretary and placed on the shrine of Our Lady in the Basilica. Arrangements for the day are under the direction of the Rev. Vincent I. Bellwoy, S.J., Moderator of the Conference.

## Gold Medal Award

New York.—Charles Donagh Maginnis, of Boston, ecclesiastical architect of nationwide prominence, will be the recipient this year of the annual gold medal of the American Irish Historical Society, James McGurran, President-General of the Society, has announced.
