Chicago Groups Aid Polish Relief Program

CHICAGO. — Through parishes, clubs and various societies more than 10,000 active women members are participating in Polish civilian war relief in Chicago area under the special direction of the Rt. Rev. Mgr. Thomas P. Bona, pastor of Our Lady of Perpetual Help Church, and the American Red Cross.

The Polish Civilian War Relief Unit was organized Sept. 2, 1939, following the invasion of Poland by the German army. To date \$52,000 has been raised and 30,000 garments have been sent to Polish refugees. At the suggestion of American Red Cross officials, food packages also were sent to Poland. The Junior unit has rolled more than 750,000 bandages.

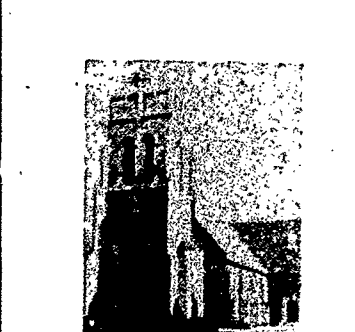
