### Bishop To Deliver '42 Chest Message At Solemn Mass

With a "double responsibility" facing workers and contributors to Rochester's 1942 Community and War Chest, a Solemn High Mass coram Episcopo will be celebrated Sunday, May 10, at 11 o'clock in Sacred Heart Cathedral to ask God's blessings on their effort.

#### FORMER SPANISH LEADER DESCRIBES CONVERSION

MARSEILLE.—(NC)—A letter published in the press of Santander, Spain, signed by Regina Garcia, former Socialist Deputy from Murcia, member of the Geneva Labor Commission and leader of the Spanish section of the Second International, tells of her conversion to the Catholic faith.

The writer accuses herself of having spread, in writings and orally, errors which exercised a bad influence on many souls.

In 1934, Regina Garcia's mother, who was an active member of Catholic Action, was accused by a radical mob of having cast a spell on the children of her district and was burned alive in the Cuatro Caminos Church.

--Every Priest To Offer Mass  
--Entire Diocese Asked To Attend Mass

In his pastoral on the Episcopal Silver Jubilee of His Holiness, Pope Pius XII, to be read at all Masses in the Diocese of Rochester, Sunday, His Excellency, Bishop Kearney will specify the following:

Every priest in the diocese will offer his Holy Sacrifice of the Mass on Wednesday, May 13 for the intention of the Holy Father.

Every man, woman and child in the diocese will be expected to assist at the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass on that day in commemoration of the Supreme Pontiff's completion of twenty-five years as a holy Bishop.

### County War-Work Survey Given Catholic School Aid

Catholic schools of Monroe county outside of Rochester are cooperating in the survey of mothers working outside the home. The purpose of the survey is to determine the needs of children whose parents are engaged in performing defense duties.

The survey is being conducted through the teachers of the public and parochial schools of the county through a questionnaire to the children. Returns from the schools are to be sent to the Catholic Education Office by May 25. The survey is being directed under the supervision of Arthur H. Craspey, Deputy Director of Civilian Production in Monroe County. Mr. Craspey urges that all parents cooperate with the school teachers in filling out the questionnaire.
