## 1942 'Catholic Mother' Chosen; Son Is Bishop

WEBSTER GROVES, MO.—Mrs. Catherine Jacobs Bartholome, of Bellechester, Minn., mother of the Most Rev. Peter W. Bartholome, Coadjutor Bishop of St. Cloud, has been chosen the Catholic Mother of 1942 by the National Catholic Conference on Family Life. It was announced today at the tenth annual session of the Conference, held at Webster College here.

Announcement of the selection was made by the Rev. Dr. Edgar Schneider, O.S.A., Executive Secretary of the Conference and Director of the Family Life Bureau of the National Catholic Welfare Conference. The selection was disclosed today because the Conference has decided to announce the choice each year on the Feast of St. Monica, Patroness of Christian Mothers.

Mrs. Bartholome was born on the Feast of St. Monica, Dr. Schneider revealed in making the announcement. She is the mother of 11 children. Besides Bishop Bartholome, another son is in the service of the Church, the Rev. John Bartholome, of Wabasha, Minn.

Mrs. Bartholome's first child, Peter, died at the age of 20. The last child was given the name of the first—the name of the Prince of the Apostles. The last and eleventh child of the family was chosen by the Holy See as a successor of the Apostles. Four of her grandchildren are in their country's service.

"Mrs. Bartholome represents the immigrant type of American," Dr. Schneider said. "She came to the United States as a young girl. She represents the pioneer type. She came to Minnesota in 1865. Every American knows what the words 'immigrant' and 'pioneer' imply in terms of the hardy virtues that made young America so robust and great."

"In honoring Mrs. Catherine Jacobs Bartholome," Dr. Schneider added, "the National Catholic Conference on Family Life realizes that it is honoring the Christian family, that most beautiful and most highly important creation that the Church gave the world. And it is indeed a great privilege to do that."

A simple medal from the Shrine of Christian Motherhood in St. Augustine, Fla., was presented to Mrs. Bartholome in commemoration of her selection.

Mrs. Bartholome was born Catherine Jacobs May 4, 1854, in Beaufort, Grand Duchy of Luxembourg. At the close of the War Between the States in America, the Jacobs family migrated to America. There were five girls and one boy in the family, five of whom are dead, but all of them lived to be octogenarians. All married and lived in various parts of Minnesota, there being 52 children among the six families.

The Jacobs family went directly to Minnesota after landing in New York, settling first in Wabasha, later moving to Bellechester, a settlement of Luxemburgers. There Miss Jacobs met Nicholas Bartholome and married him in the presence of Father James Trobec, later Bishop of St. Cloud.
