Lynch, editor of the Catholic Sun, Syracuse, and editor of The Western Whirlwind in Boston, said a large audience Sunday night at St. Joseph's Academy, Syracuse, N. Y.

Common objections to poetry, as a means of expression, were answered by the speaker. The poetry was essentially for the "higher," or that its appreciation is by the fortunate who are illumined by its simple words by Father Lynch. He declared there is no communication between man and man but poetry is communication between the whole man and whole man, done intensely.
