Rebuild 200 Churches in Spain

LONDON.—Of more than 400 churches destroyed in Spain during the civil war, 26 have been entirely rebuilt, and 181 entirely restored. Vatican Radio informs in a short wave program heard here. More than 30 convents, hospitals and religious institutions damaged by fire or bombardment have been rebuilt.

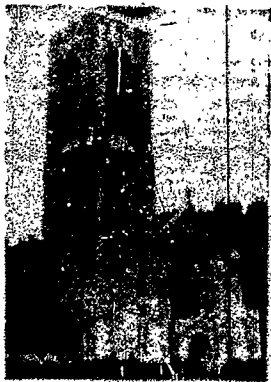

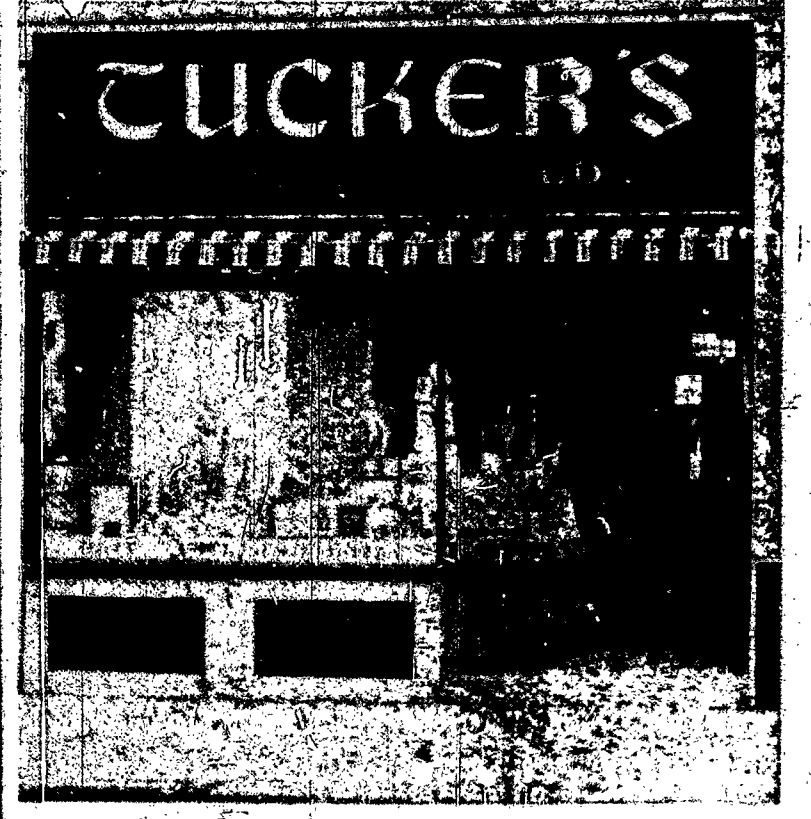
