"Were it a question only of purs-ty temporal political or social matters, or of conflicting claims between different peoples or races, or of idealogies concerning probisms of a material order coly. Bishop says, "we would say nothing: we would only deplore this descent to stavism and barbarity of the most observable feelings of good, honor, justice and truth. But ideslogies which have a direct effect on that revealed truth which it is our duty to defend within us.
