Learn First Aid

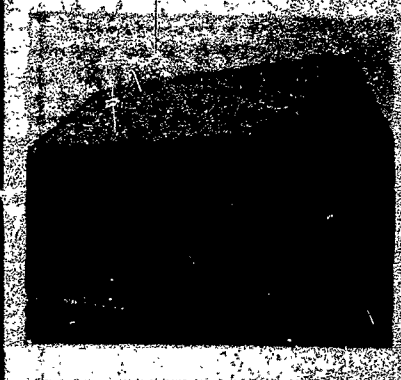

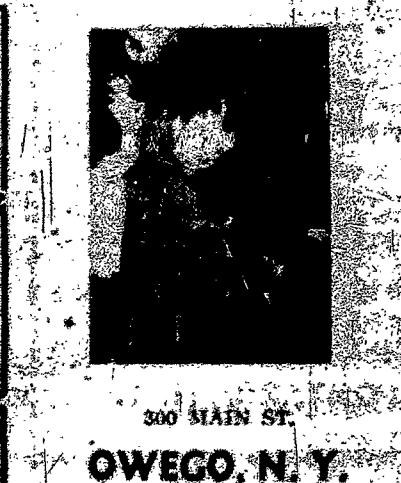
'OUR LADY OF NEW YORK'
