

Prelate Dies At 92

HAUSVILLE—The Most Rev. Pierre Philippe Giraudau, Titular Bishop of Daphnusis and former Vicar Apostolic of Tibet and vel-

eran of the Franco-Prussian war, has died at Fataonita. The 92-year-old prelate left France for the foreign missions in 1878 and never returned to his native land. Born on March 17, 1850, he fought with the Seventh Hussars in 1870.

Non-Catholic Governor Pays Church Tribute

RICHMOND, Va.—(NC)—"The Catholic Church stands today, as it has stood for centuries, like a rock in a wasting world," and, when peace comes, will "play a magnificent part in bringing back to exhausted and war-torn people the opportunity for a finer and a cleaner and a better life."

This statement was made by Virginia's non-Catholic Governor Chas. W. Darden, in an address at the banquet Tuesday night which brought to a close the three-day convention of the Catholic Committee of the South here.

"I want to say because I can say it to you as an outsider, what a profound respect I feel for the great organization to which you have the honor to bring," Governor Darden said.

"The Catholic Church today stands as it has stood for centuries, like a rock in a wasting world. It offers to mankind every where a sanctuary to which he can repair with some chance for the future."

"It is the one great organization, or certainly one of the great organizations in human history, that is international in its scope. Its profound beliefs span political boundaries. It appeals to the right-thinking people everywhere, and I have no doubt that when the day comes that this peace is written—that your great Church is going to play a magnificent part in bringing back to exhausted and weary people the opportunity, which they so much desire for a finer and a cleaner and a better life."

newspaper editorials which told of this patriot's unselfish devotion to the American people of which he was a part. In addition to lending \$600,000 to the struggling young government, money loaned without a penny interest at a time when the government was forced to pay from 20 to 40 per cent for money—if indeed it could get anyone at all to trust it—he spent the remainder of his fortune in outfitting troops, paying government expenses and negotiating with France for both money and soldiers. Like Robert Morris, he died utterly penniless, for virtually none of this money was ever repaid.

Should anyone think that Haym Salomon was an exception, detailed history of the War for Independence shows that several Jews were among Washington's most able and trusted officers and that Jewish patriots, in proportion to their small percentage of the population, served in the ranks throughout all the campaigns. This is easily understood by those who understand Jewish nature, for the spirit of independence, liberty and justice burns fiercely within them, sometimes causing them to take what appears to be radical stands in political and social ideologies.

By Civil War time, the Jewish population had increased considerably in this country and both Northern and Southern armies held Jewish volunteers far in excess of their proportionate requirements. Several thousand served as officers, and many others filled wartime civil posts with distinction. A Jew was the first American to fall in the Spanish-American War and their record in World War I is a proud one. Although prejudice and intolerance claim a lack of patriotism on the Jew's part, there is nothing in the record to prove it. In fact, history proves they are one of the nation's most dependable groups, both in war and peace.

Much of this possible evil can be mitigated in advance if Christians will begin immediately to work unceasingly for the true brotherhood of man.

Just as light always dispels darkness, so will properly practiced Christian virtue dispel the gloom which always descends upon a land when intolerance and bigotry hold sway.
