by the Rev. Joseph De Fazio, C.M.R. This is a wonderful opportunity to clarify some of the problems of the teen-age group, as the theme is of special interest and encouragement to them.

The Eighth Grade girls and boys are also attending to prepare and smooth the way for the great change in their lives as they leave grammar school. Solemn closing takes place Sunday morning.

and extremely delicate positions of trust, and he has always shown himself worthy of their confidence, a zealous and untiring laborer for the rights of God and of the Church among the nations of the earth.

In the midst of honors and dignities, the Holy Father, the speaker said, "has been, withal, a man of humble, sincere piety, a true servant of Jesus Christ, His Divine Master, whose love he has always sought to enkindle in the hearts of all to whom he has been sent."

Achievements Cited
Father Maney recalled the success of Archbishop Eugenio Pacelli as Apostolic Nuncio to Bavaria and the part he played in signing of the two Concordats, one with Bavaria in 1924 and the other with Prussia in 1929. Cited also were

the achievements of Cardinal Pacelli as Secretary of State.

Raised to become the 262nd successor of St. Peter, the very first message of Pius XII to the world after his election to the Papacy, Father Maney recalled, was a plea for peace.

"But the leaders of nations in their selfish pride and lust for power, have not listened to the paternal plea of the Holy Father," the speaker declared and cited the Encyclical of Oct. 30, 1939 pleading with the world for peace.

"Today," said Father Maney, "this Solemn Pontifical Mass is offered to God by our Bishop for the intention of the Sovereign Pontiff. Today throughout this diocese, throughout our country, and throughout the world the faithful kneel on their knees with their priests and Bishops united in a tremendous supplication to God for the Vicar of Christ.

"He is the rock of unity, the center of Faith, the one Shepherd over the one fold of Christ. Let us pray that God will preserve him for the Church and grant him life, and make him happy on earth, and deliver him not into the hands of his enemies, so that soon, in God's gracious disposition, the dearest desire of his heart may be fulfilled."

The student choir of St. Bernard's Seminary under the direction of the Rev. Benedict Ehmman sang the Mass. Representatives from Rochester Catholic colleges, the Nursing School of St. Mary's Hospital and Catholic high schools were present with the faithful gathered to honor the Holy Father.

Chaplain Is First Bishop To Cross Atlantic In Bomber

OTTAWA.—The Most Rev. C. L. Nelligan, Principal Catholic Chaplain of the Canadian Armed Forces and Bishop of Pembroke, has arrived in England in a bomber flown across the Atlantic from Canada.

This is Bishop Nelligan's second trip overseas to inspect the various Catholic chaplains in England, but it was his first by air. By his flight Bishop Nelligan became the first Catholic Bishop to cross the Atlantic in a bomber.
