Sodality May Day Draws Students From Western New York

BUFFALO — The annual May Day of the Western New York Sodality Conference was held last Sunday at the National Shrine of Our Lady of Victory in Lackawanna where over 1,000 members of the Conference witnessed a ceremony that was part of the World Sodality Day.

The Very Rev. Thomas J. Coughlin, S.J., President of Constatine College, in his sermon urged the Sodality members to be faithful to their patron, the Mother of God. "Let the fervor of your youth in Our Blessed Mother never diminish," Father Coughlin told them, "and she will be ever waiting for you in your hours of trial. Mary watches over your daily actions and with her deep love for her Son ever in His mind, she will be always prepared to intercede for you in Heaven. Father Coughlin congratulated all those who had come to the Shrine to honor the Mother of God.

James Chambers of St. Joseph's Collegiate Institute, Secretary of the Conference, recited the Rosary while Mr. J. Theodore Schueckler, of Canisius College, President of the Conference, read the Act of Consecration, the Litany of Our Lady and the Prayer for our Soldiers. Prior to the service, the names of all the relatives and friends of members of the Conference were placed on the Shrine of Our Lady of Victory and consecrated to Her. A solemn Military Benediction with the Rev. Joseph M. Maguire, Director of the Shrine as Celebrant, the Rev. John J. Dempsey of the Newman Club of State Teachers as Deacon and the Rev. James A. Malone, S.J., of Canisius High School as Subdeacon, closed the exercises. Cadets of Stella Niagara Seminary presented the colors of the American and Papal Flags during Benediction while taps were sounded for the Missing Boys of Canisius High School, St. Joseph's Collegiate Institute, Newman High School, St. Mary's Niagara Falls and Our Lady of Victory Academy served the Benediction. Miss Haline Czeroran presided at the organ while the Glee Club of Our Lady of Victory Academy assisted with the congregational singing.
