A Low Mass for the intention of servicemen's mothers will be offered by His Excellency, Bishop Kearney in St. Joseph's Church, Franklin Street on Thursday morning, May 21 at 9:30 a. m.

The Bishop will preach at the Mass to which are being invited mothers of sons in the Army, Navy, Marine Corps and Coast Guard.

Pastors will announce the time and place of the Mass on Sunday from the pulpits.

In various churches of the diocese the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass is being offered once a month. Mothers who attend those Masses as well as all other mothers of servicemen are being invited to the Bishop's Mass.

Monsignor Sheen is a priest of the Diocese of Peoria, Illinois, a graduate of the Spaulding Institute in Peoria where he received his A.B. and A.M. degrees; the St. Paul Seminary, St. Paul, Minnesota, and the Catholic University of America in Washington, D. C. He took his degree Doctor of Philosophy at Laval University, studied in the University of Paris and received his Doctorate of Divinity in Rome.

The Monsignor was commanded by Pope Pius XI to speak on Communism for two years over the National hookup and spoke in Westminster Cathedral, London, by special invitation of His Eminence Cardinal Bourne, Archbishop of Westminster Cathedral. He has spoken in Syracuse each year for the past five years, addressed the graduate nurses in Rochester a few years ago; spoke to the Newman Club at Cornell University last Spring and gave the address at the Catholic Charities dinner in Elmira, in October, 1941.

The lecture has aroused considerable interest in Auburn among the professional men and people of different faiths who are anxiously awaiting to hear Monsignor Sheen's discussion of "Religion in a world at war."

## Holy Father Paid Homage Throughout Diocese On 25th Episcopal Jubilee

### Tribute To Pope Of Peace' Given At Pontifical Mass

"Pius XII will always be known as the Pope of Peace."

Thus declared the Rev. John E. Maney of St. Andrew's Seminary faculty, who studied for the Holy Priesthood in Rome, at the Solemn Pontifical Mass commemorating the Holy Father's Silver Episcopal Jubilee in Sacred Heart Cathedral Wednesday, May 13, the anniversary date.

With His Excellency, the Most Rev. James R. Kearney, D.D., Bishop of Rochester officiating, the solemn but joyous liturgical ceremony was conducted as the central offering of prayer in the diocese for His Holiness, Pope Pius XII.

Throughout the diocese special Masses were offered by each priest and the faithful attended these Masses in paying prayerful homage to the Supreme Pontiff. A spiritual bouquet of Masses, Holy Communions and other devotions was prepared by the children in the diocesan schools. (See adjacent column.)

Assisting the Bishop were: Assistant Priest, the Rt. Rev. Msgr. William M. Hart, V.G.; Deacons of Honor the Rt. Rev. Msgr. William F. Bergan, Chancellor of the diocese; and the Rt. Rev. Msgr. Charles E. Shay; Master of Ceremonies, the Rt. Rev. Msgr. J. F. Goggin; Students of St. Bernard's Seminary filled the minor offices.

Exemplified ideals "The man whose silver jubilee as a Bishop, the world over is celebrating today has exemplified perfectly the ideals of Holy Church," Father Maney declared in his sermon.

"He has throughout those 25 years shown himself a man of firm faith, a messenger and Apostle of peace, an indefatigable preacher of the word of God, a shepherd whose care for the flock of Christ has ever been first and foremost in his heart; a faithful servant in God's house to whom the Sovereign Pontiffs have confided many important

### Fr. Cleary To Compile Clergyman-Pilot List

ITHACA, N. Y. — (N.C.W.C.) — The Rev. Donald M. Cleary, National Chairman of the Newman Club Federation and chaplain of the Newman Club at Cornell University here, has been appointed by the national office of the Civil Air Patrol to compile a list of all priests, ministers and rabbis who are airplane pilots.

The list was sought by the Civil Air Patrol in order to encourage these clergymen to take an active part in the patrol's work in their own communities and to highlight their presence and encouragement the morale of those engaged in this phase of civilian defense. The completed list, Father Cleary said, will include name, address, denomination, number of flying hours, rating and "any other information which would be of some value" for each clergyman.
