Fr. Flanagan, Former Aquinas Teacher, Dies

Rev. Joseph Berchmans Flanagan, C. S. B., who taught at Aquinas Institute, from 1928 to 1930, died in Detroit on Sunday, May 3. He was also a former member of the faculty of St. Michael's College, Toronto.
Born in Wallaceburg, Ontario, February 24, 1902, he was educated there and at Assumption College, Windsor, receiving his B. A. degree there in 1924. He then entered the Basilian Novitiate, Toronto, and was ordained by the late Archbishop McNeill in St. Basil's Church on June 30, 1928.

Card Party To Benefit Diocesan Deaf Work

A Card Party sponsored by the St. Francis Deaf-Social Unit for the benefit of St. Francis Deaf-Social Chapel for the Deaf at Rochester and vicinity will be held Thursday evening, May 14, in Columbus Civic Center Auditorium. Besides raising for the adult Deaf, the chapel has under its care the Catholic children of the Rochester Deaf School, affording these children the privilege of Sunday and Holyday Mass and religious instruction every week. The chapel bears the expense of transporting these children to and from school and these Card Parties are the sole means of making this possible. We hope our friends will be as charitable as they have been in the past.

Third Order Of St. Francis

The May meeting of the Third Order of St. Francis will be held as usual at 3:30 o'clock on Sunday, May 24, at St. Patrick's Church, Plymouth Avenue North. Since May is the month of the Blessed Mother, the Franciscan Crown (the rosary used by Franciscans) is of special interest. This rosary is composed of seven decades in honor of the seven joys of Our Lady. It was introduced into the Order of St. Francis in the year 1422, by a novice who, before joining the order, was accustomed to placing a crown of flowers on a statue of the Blessed Virgin. Not being allowed to continue this devotion, he resolved to leave the order. Our Lady appeared to him, however, and told him that he could offer her a much more pleasing crown by reciting daily a rosary of seven decades in honor of her seven joys.

Since then, it has been a pious custom in the Franciscan Order to recite this Crown every day. St. Bernardine of Siena and St. Leonard of Port Maurice were two famous Franciscans who ascribed many graces to the recitation of the Franciscan Crown.

Rev. Bartholomew O'Brien, spiritual director of the Third Order, has issued the following statement in regard to the General Absolution:

- (1) The General Absolution can be given privately (in the confessional) on the day appointed or on the preceding day or within eight days after the day for which it has been granted.
(2) In the confessional, any priest can give the Absolution.
(3) Sacramental Confession is not necessary; only the place (the confessional box) is prescribed.
(4) The "short form" should be presented for the priest for his convenience.
