Niagara U. President Marks Silver Sacerdotal Jubilee

NIAGARA UNIVERSITY, N. Y.—A quarter of a century's devotion to priestly labor and a decade as executive of Niagara University will be recognized by the national alumni association when a banquet in honor of the Very Rev. Joseph M. Noon, C.M., S.T.D., LL.D. is held in Hotel Niagara on Thursday, May 21. Father Noonan will celebrate his twenty-fifth anniversary in the Holy Priesthood on May 24. Faculty members, seminarians, collegians and office employees honored the silver jubilarian on May 10 when at a Mass celebrated by him, the Rev. Kieran P. Moran, C.M. paid a glowing tribute. Among outstanding personalities expected to attend the alumni dinner will be the Most Rev. James E. Keane, Bishop of Rochester; the Most Rev. John A. Duffy, Bishop of Buffalo and chancellor of the university, the Very Rev. William Slattery, C.M. head of the Eastern Province of the Vincentian Fathers and Governor Lehman, an honorary alumnus. Father Noonan has been the

longest reigning president in Niagara's 24 years of educational history. He is one who has been responsible in many ways for the rapid growth, physically and scholastically, of the university in the past ten years. Since his advent in 1921, Father Noonan has watched Niagara's registration almost triple itself; directed the establishment of a division of the university in Rochester; increased expansion of the Niagara Falls division; brought about greater diversity in inter-collegiate athletics; and wider development of educational and extra-curricular pursuits. Some of the notable achievements under his regime were the establishment of the Reserve Officers' Training Corps in 1936; the Civilian Pilot Training program and Varsity Village, modern collegiate residential project on the campus. An idea of the esteem in which his contemporaries hold him was manifested last autumn when he was unanimously elected president of the Association of Colleges and Universities in the State of New York at one of the most critical periods in the history of educational institutions.
