First Bishop of New Diocese Consecrated

BOGOTÁ (INC.)—The first Bishop of the new Diocese of Jericó, the Most Rev. Antonio J. Jaramillo Tolosa, was consecrated in the Jericó Cathedral by His Excellency, the Most Rev. Carlos Servas, Apostolic Nuncio to Colombia.

Co-consecrators were the Most Revs. Miguel Angel Belón, Bishop of Santa Rosa de Osos, and Francisco Cristóbal Toró, Bishop of Armenia. Present at the ceremony were delegations of Departmental and Municipal civil officials within the new Diocese.
