Senior Musicale At St. Agnes Institute Enjoyed

The Annual Senior Recital of St. Agnes Conservatory of Music and Art was held in the School Auditorium last Monday evening. An appreciative audience listened with interest to the program made up of piano, violin, cello, harp and orchestra numbers; and gave merited applause to the dancing numbers that followed.

Among pupils who gave piano numbers were Lillian Warner, Kathleen Kuebel, Katherine Heister, Colette Stanley, Grace McDonnell, Jean Schaeffer. Violin numbers by Elaine Robinson and Colette Stanley, a cello number by Miss Kuebel, a harp solo by Miss Heister and a harp solo by Miss Warner, gave variety to the program and demonstrated the artistic ability of the performers.

Classical numbers were to the fore, including pieces by Dubois, Monti, Mozart, Borowski, Shostakovich, Slaughter, Schubert, Johann Strauss, Brahms, von Weber, Koller, Glinka-Balchikow. Many of them were of the difficult order that calls for real musical ability; the performers were equal to their task. They interpreted the numbers with a musical sense, and artistic feeling, that spoke well for the pupils and for the Sisters who have trained them so well.

The dance numbers were given by pupils of the Senior, Intermediate and Junior Classes, and varied from snappy tap pieces to classic types of interpretive dancing. The attractive costumes and the lighting effects gave a fine setting for a most entertaining and pleasing program.

Worthy of special mention were Colette Stanley, Rosemary Lane, Theresa Kost, Catherine O'Keefe, who appeared in solo and duet numbers.
