SODALITY BANQUET

There, after the traditional crowning of the May queen, Father O'Connor spoke an invocation to the Mother of God and blessed the roses before him to the daily processions at one of the most famous of Mary's shrines, at Lourdes in France. The members of the Sodality then renewed their act of consecration to the Blessed Virgin and the ceremony was brought to a close with Benediction of the Blessed Sacrament.

A final Mass for adults who are to be confirmed will be held on Friday evening, May 21, in the Church hall, immediately following May devotions at about 8:15. Adults from the parish will be confirmed on Sunday, the feast of Pentecost, at Corpus Christi Church at 7:15.

May devotions in honor of the Blessed Mother of God are being conducted each Wednesday, Thursday and Friday evening during the month at 7:00. The school children are adding to the beauty of the services by singing hymns in honor of the Blessed Virgin. Each week one of the upper grades in the school is providing the music for the devotions.

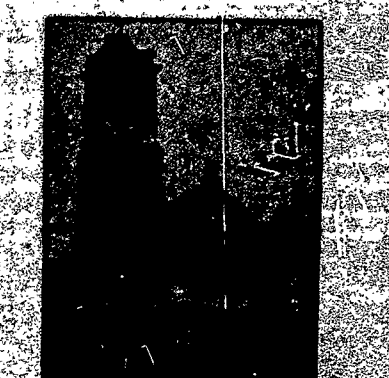
