ST. BONAVENTURE — St. Bonaventure College has been approved by the U. S. Navy Department for the new V-1 Officers training program, which is available to sophomores, freshmen and prospective freshmen, the Rev. Lambert Zaleska, O.F.M., Dean of Studies announced today.

Enlistment in the V-1 Plan immediately establishes the student's status in the armed services, and exempts him from selective service requirements, thus assuring him of at least two calendar years of calendar years of college study. At the end of this period, those who qualify will be accepted under the V-7 plan for Deck and Engineering Officer's training, and may continue to graduation, when active service will begin.

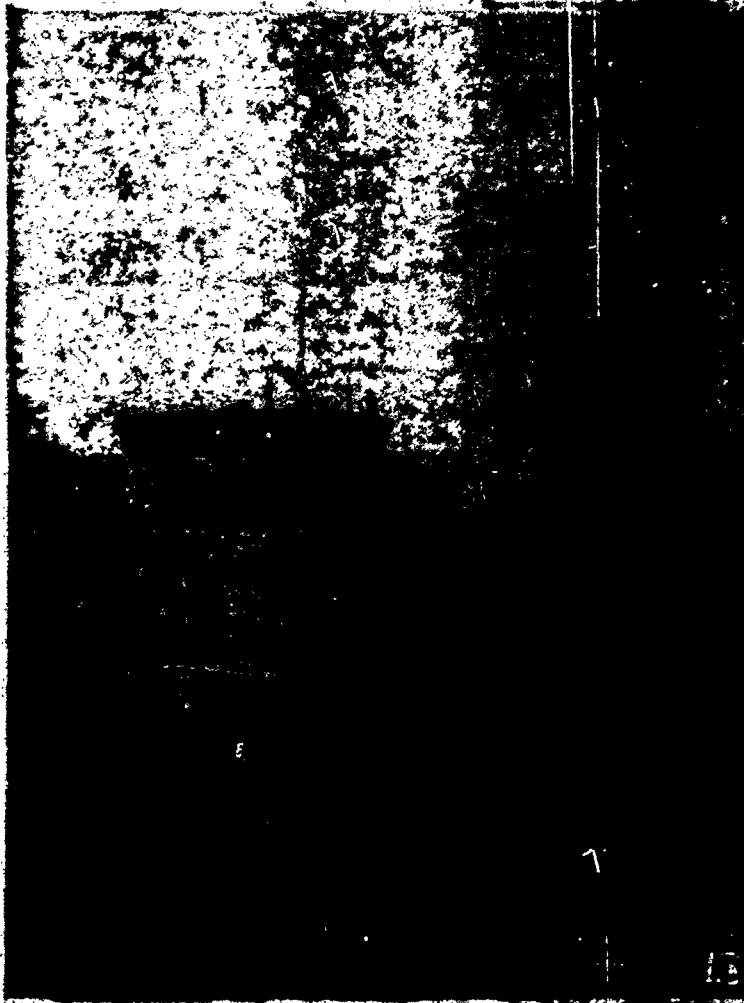
