

Noted Missioners Heard At De Sales High Rally

GENEVA—One of the most outstanding programs on the calendar of the De Sales High School for this season was the Mission Rally for Vocations conducted on Wednesday at the school. Present for the occasion were several prominent clergymen who have been attending a Mission convention in Rochester. They addressed the students during the program.

Opening with general assembly at 2 o'clock the Mission Rally was attended by all of the students and several guests.

After prayers for vocations, Very Rev. Monsignor Edward Freking, executive secretary of the Catholic Students Mission Crusade and editor-in-chief of "The Shield" spoke on the subject of "Vocations—the Crying Need in the Mission Crisis."

This address was followed by brief remarks by Rev. Thomas Sampson M. M., of the faculty of Maryknoll Apostolic College, Clark Summit, Pa.

Panel discussions were held at 3 o'clock and the opening subject was "Should India Have Her Freedom?" with Rev. Joseph Veards, C. S. C., as leader.

"Missions in a World at War" was the subject for the discussion led by Rev. Howard Felsecker, M. M., formerly secretary to Archbishop Marella, Apostolic delegate to Japan.

The third topic was "Christianizing America," by Rev. Howard Bishop.

Closing exercises were held at 4 o'clock at St. Stephen's Church, when the Rev. Aloysius Coogan, secretary of the Missionary Union of the Clergy, and editor of the magazine "Catholic Missions" gave an address entitled "Tribute to His Holiness, Pope Pius XII," in honor of the 25th Episcopal Jubilee of Pope Pius which was celebrated on Wednesday.

Also on the program was Rev. Richard Ackerman, C. S. Sp., National Director of the Holy Childhood Association.

The service was closed with Benediction of the Blessed Sacrament and recitation of a special prayer for the Pope. Mission hymns were then sung.
