Pay Final Tribute To Sister Mary Aid

HORNELL.—A Solemn Mass of Requiem was celebrated Tuesday morning, May 19, in St. Ann's Church, Hornell, for Sister Mary Aid, former superintendent of St. James' Mercy Hospital, Hornell, who died at the hospital early Sunday morning, May 17.

The Mass was celebrated by Rev. Andrew T. DiSanti, pastor of St. Ann's Church, Hornell, N. Y. He was assisted by Rev. Ignatius X. Cameron, pastor of St. Ignatius Loyola Parish, Hornell, as deacon, and the Rev. William Frank of Cohocton, as sub-deacon. The Rev. Joseph Emer of Yates, N. Y., was master of ceremonies.

Present in the sanctuary were the Rt. Rev. Mgr. Charles F. Shay, the Rev. Fathers William Cannon, Charles Huter, Robert Kelleher, Earl Tobin, William Byrne and John Newcomb.

The funeral procession was led by the Superintendent of Nurses of St. James' Mercy Hospital and student nurses in uniform. A large number of Sisters of Mercy from Rochester, Corning, Elmira and Hornell were followed by the relatives of the deceased.

The Hospital Board of Managers were present in a body, as were also the entire Medical Staff of the hospital. A large delegation of the Nurses' Alliance, the Women's Board of the Hospital, and the Junior Auxiliary also followed in procession.

A choir of Sisters of Mercy sang the Mass, and the Rev. John E. O'Malley assisted at the organ. Sister Mary Aid (Catherine Leary) was born in County Clare, Ireland, on March 23, 1878. She entered the Community of the Sisters of Mercy in 1898 at the Motherhouse, which was then located in Hornellville, and in the fall of that same year came to the hospital. She was professed in Rochester in 1902.

For forty-three years Sister Mary Aid faithfully served on the staff of the hospital in various capacities. She was, in turn, nurse, floor supervisor, x-ray technician, and from 1930 to 1934 she was superintendent of the hospital.

Despite impaired health, Sister Mary Aid continued in active duty until, in 1937, a fractured hip incapacitated her for the work she loved so well, and for five years she lingered in patient suffering.

The City of Hornell cherishes the memory of Sister Mary Aid. Her name symbolizes to all who know her the essence of charity, unselfishness, and untiring devotion to the sick. She was in truth, "an angel of mercy." May her soul rest in peace!

Sister Mary Aid is survived by two brothers, Patrick Leary of Ithaca, N. Y., and Cornelius Leary of Buffalo, N. Y.; two sisters in Ireland, Mrs. William McInerney and Mrs. Thomas Walsh, and several nieces and nephews.
