FIRST ORDAINED

Rev. Donald E. Dailey of St. Margaret Mary's parish of this city was ordained Saturday in the old Cathedral in St. Augustine's in Florida by the Most Rev. Joseph P. Hurley, Bishop of that diocese. Father Dailey will offer his first solemn High Mass in St. Margaret Mary's Church of this city next Sunday morning at 10:00 o'clock.

He is the first young man from the parish to be ordained to the priesthood. The sermon will be preached by the pastor, the Rev. Charles E. Bruton.

Father Dailey is the son of Mr. and Mrs. Mykes Tierney of 102 Pontiac Drive. He was born in Corning, received his elementary education in St. Mary's parochial school in that city and was graduated from Aquinas Institute, Rochester, in 1933. Following his graduation from St. Michael's College and the University of Toronto in 1937, Father Dailey entered St. Bernard's Seminary. His theological training was completed this year at St. Mary's Seminary in Baltimore.

Father Gannon read parts from letters received by him from the Rev. John F. Woloch, who was associated with Father Gannon at St. Mary's Parish, later being transferred to St. Charles's Parish, Elmira, and who had fallen victim to

many as a chaplain. Father Woloch was mentioned at that meeting as having been killed at Midway Island in the attack on Pearl Harbor. He was the first of all clergy to be fighting forces of the United States for the Christian world war. He also mentioned a offering from a West Coast newspaper at May 28, 1942, which was written by Father Gannon, First Chaplain of the Pacific Fleet.


