Catholic Guidance Given In Current Events By Verein

(Because of the profound deliration given resolutions of the Catholic Central Verein and their timeliness they will be reproduced in this column from time to time).

CURRENT INSTALLMENT BUYING

The Government ruling concerning the curtailment of installment buying and consumer credit in general prompted a resolution by the Catholic Central Verein of America at its 84th annual meeting in New York City in August. The convention declared there are many more important considerations involved than the threat of inflation. The next of the resolution follows:

With the flow of money, stimulated by the defense program, with wages in certain instances soaring to almost unbelievable heights, the buying of luxuries has increased tremendously. Workers are purchasing many articles they do not need, at exorbitant prices. Truly, the ten-dollar-a-shirt era, reminiscent of the World War, seems once more at hand.

Dependent on this condition is, it is rendered even worse by the fact that so many of the purchases are being made on the installment plan. This situation, almost certain to bring about inflation, has caused even financiers to worry. And so, in order to conserve labor and materials necessary for national defense, the administration has issued a proclamation intended to curb installment buying.

But apart from these reasons there is a more important consideration, viz., excessive and indiscriminate use of the installment plan will work an incalculable injury to individuals as well as families, when the present bubble shall have burst and over-extended credits shall cause bankruptcy upon bankruptcy.

The strict law of the manufacturer and inventor should be applied and credits strictly curtailed. Attention should be called to the credit union where over-purchasing must be made. Borrowing from a credit union in order to pay for a commodity is a much better expedient than filling the coffers of the money lender by buying on the installment plan. However, we would at the same time caution credit unions not to be caught by the spreading fever and not to grant loans to members, indiscriminately for impulsive spending or the purchase of unnecessary goods.

Priest Lauded For Aid To Labor

BOGOTA—On the occasion of the establishment of a branch of the Circle of Workers, the Most Rev. Luis Cancha, Bishop of Huancayo, sent a letter to Father Campesano praising and congratulating him upon the success of his activities in behalf of the working classes.

The words of Father Campesano, the Bishop said, constitute "the happy realization of the Pontifical directives in social matters, especially those given by Pape Leo XIII."

"The words of Your Reverence," the letter added, "very happily interpret the desire of the Sovereign

Pontiff. They do not consist in simple treatment against other social classes, rather they seek to make the worker understand the dignity of his position as a part of the divine plan, and that labor was especially sanctified by the Son of God because it is the working of an artisan."
