Pontifical Approval Given Mission Helpers Of The Sacred Heart

By recent Decree of the Holy See, the Mission Helpers of the Sacred Heart, a Community of missionary Sisters, are now established as a religious congregation with papal approval for their Institute. Word of the Pontifical approbation of the Institute and of its Constitutions was received from Rome by Most Rev. Michael J. Curley, Archbishop of Baltimore and Washington.

Founded in Baltimore in 1886, the Mission Helpers of the Sacred Heart now have fourteen convents scattered throughout two archdioceses — Baltimore and New York, and five dioceses: Trenton, Ponce, St. Augustine, San Juan and Pinar del Rio.

The aim of these missionary Sisters is the extension of the Kingdom of the Sacred Heart through religious instruction. This is carried on chiefly in classes for Catholic pupils of public grade and high schools, in census taking and in parish visiting. In this latter field, the activities always include among the results, cases brought to baptism, marriages brought to validation, persons influenced to return to the Sacraments, converts instructed and children transferred from the public to the parochial schools. Corresponding aid is given in the hospitals, and in Puerto Rico, at the Labor Colony as well.

The Archbishop of New York is represented in the Community by eleven vocations from that city; the Diocese of Rochester by five vocations from Geneva and Westchester, and the Diocese of Brooklyn by five Sisters from that city. With the canonical approval, it is expected that the number of Mission Helpers of the Sacred Heart will increase very rapidly to meet the growing demands for their services in this country.

War Pilot, Visiting Shrine, Attributes His Success To 'Good St. Anne'

STE. ANNE DE BEAUPRE, Que.—Pilot Officer Paul Emilio Morin, French-Canadian who made 22 flights over enemy territory as a member of the Royal Canadian Air Force and won the Distinguished Flying Medal for his bravery, lost no time in visiting the internationally-known shrine of Ste. Anne de Beaupre on his return to Canada.

Attributing his success to "Good St. Anne" he made a pilgrimage here with two friends as an expression of thanks for the protection which had been accorded him.

Pilot Officer Morin said he never had been without a medal of Ste. Anne on all his flights. P. O. Morin once had planned to become a Christian Brother, and had taught with the Christian Brothers before the war, but decided the religious life was not to be his vocation.

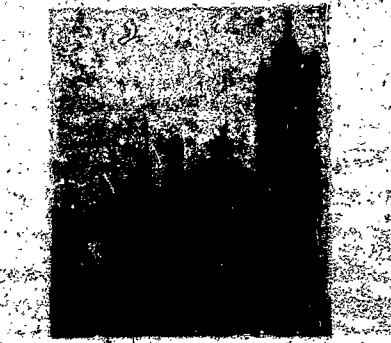

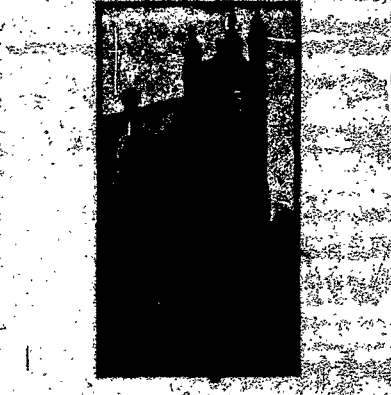
