## Holy Orders Will Be Conferred On 11 On June 6

Representing various sections of the diocese, eleven members of the 1942 graduating class of St. Bernard's Seminary will be ordained to the Holy Priesthood by His Excellency, the Most Rev. James E. Kearney, D.D., Bishop of Rochester at 11 a. m. in Sacred Heart Cathedral, Saturday, June 6.

One young man, member of the Congregation of St. Basil, will be ordained with the class.

The 1942 Ordinandi of St. Bernard's Seminary are: the Rev. Henry F. Adamaki, St. Stanislaus; the Rev. Edridge C. Bauer, St. Andrews; the Rev. Thomas K. Cleary, Corpus Christi; the Rev. Walter E. Fleming, Jr., Sacred Heart Cathedral; the Rev. Clarence W. Gardner, St. Mary's; the Rev. Paul J. Gibbons, Holy Rosary; the Rev. Joseph L. Hogan, St. Rose, Lima; the Rev. John D. Being ordained with his class is the Rev. Joseph M. Egan of St. Mary's, Massachusetts who was studying in the North American College and was forced by the war to return to the United States. He completed his course at St. Mary's of the Lake Seminary, Mundelein, Ill.

A member of the Basilian order which is in charge of Aquinas Institute, the Rev. Walter E. Fleming, C.S.B., Immaculate Conception parish, will be ordained with the 1942 class. A former teacher at Nazareth College, he was also at one time on the CATHOLIC COURIER editorial staff and appeared at St. Bernard's Seminary.

The Rev. Edward A. Shannon of this year's class is a twin brother of the Rev. Albert J. Shannon, assistant pastor of St. Thomas Church. Also in the class is the Rev. Thomas K. Cleary, a brother of the Rev. Donald M. Cleary, Catholic Chaplain, Cornell University and national chaplain of the Newman Club Federation.

This year's graduating class of St. Bernard's Seminary numbers 27, it is announced by the Rt. Rev. Mgr. J. F. Goggin, rector. Besides the 11 being ordained here, there are the following to be ordained in their respective dioceses: 1 for Albany; 1 for Fall River, Mass.; 1, Trenton; 1, Hartford; 1, Syracuse and 2, Camden.

## Bishop Officiates At Final Tribute To Fr. Leo A. Smith

With a Solemn Pontifical Mass of Requiem offered by His Excellency, Bishop Kearney, final tribute was accorded to the Rev. Leo A. Smith in Immaculate Conception Church, Wednesday, May 27.

Father Smith, 39, chaplain of St. Mary's Boys' Home and St. Patrick's Girls' Home for the last two years, died Monday, May 25, 1942, after a long illness.

LONDON. — Married Poles grieved suffering Malta in a message which General Sikorski sent to the Governor of the beleaguered island when news came that Britain's most Catholic corner had been awarded the George Cross for its heroic fortitude.

General Sikorski wrote: "The ruins of Valletta and Maltese churches, just as the ruins of Poland bear testimony to the law of freedom felt equally by Maltese and Poles. Our Christian Maltese will be victorious over the pagan forces. I congratulate you on the superb stand of all forces defending this important outpost of the Christian World."
