Holy Orders Will Be Conferred On 11 On June 6

Representing various sections of the diocese, eleven members of the 1942 graduating class of St. Bernard's Seminary will be ordained to the Holy Priesthood by His Excellency, the Most Rev. James E. Kearney, D.D., Bishop of Rochester at 8 a. m. in Sacred Heart Cathedral, Saturday, June 6.

One young man, member of the Congregation of St. Basil, will be ordained with the class.

Being ordained with his class is the Rev. Joseph M. Egan of St. Mary's, Horseheads who was studying in the North American College and was forced by the war to return to the United States. He completed his course at St. Mary's of the Lake Seminary, Mundelein, Ill.

A member of the Basilian order which is in charge of Aquinas Institute, the Rev. Walter V. Sullivan, C.S.B., Immaculate Conception parish, will be ordained with the 1942 class. A former teacher at Aquinas Institute, he was also at one time on the CATHOLIC COURIER editorial staff and prepared at St. Bernard's Seminary.

The Rev. Edward A. Shamon of this year's class is a twin brother of the Rev. Albert J. Shamon, assistant pastor of St. Thomas Church. Also in the class is the Rev. Thomas K. Cleary, a brother of the Rev. Donald M. Cleary, Catholic Chaplain, Cornell University and national chaplain of the Newman Club Federation.

Auburn Honors War Dead At Memorial Mass May 30

AUBURN—All arrangements for the Second Annual Memorial Day Mass to be held at St. Joseph's Cemetery, Saturday morning, at 9 o'clock were completed at a meeting held last Sunday in St. Alphonsus Parish House.

This Mass is offered to honor all departed World War Veterans and their families.

Officers of the Mass will be: Celebrant the Rev. Frederick G. Straub, Deacon, the Very Rev. John A. Conway, Subdeacon, the Rev. Dr. William E. Cowen and Master of Ceremony the Rev. John B. Crowley.

The sermon will be preached by the Rev. Joseph McNamara, assistant pastor at St. Mary's Church. The Mass will begin promptly at 9 o'clock and will be finished shortly before 10 o'clock.

Bus Service Arranged
There will be bus service to and from the cemetery for those desiring to attend. The bus service will be every 15 minutes starting at 8 A. M. to convey the worshippers to and from the cemetery. Buses will also be available to St. Hyacinth's, SS Peter and Paul and St. Francis d'Assisi Churches in the outlying districts.

The American Legion Drum and Bugle Corps will attend the Memorial Mass and will wear their blue and gold uniforms for the first time.

Arrangements for the Mass have been in charge of a committee of representatives of the different Holy Name Societies of the city, the American Legion, the Veterans of Foreign Wars and the Disabled Veterans.

John H. Mahan, Commander of W. Mynderse Rise Post, American Legion is general chairman assisted by a large committee. The Mass will be sung by the men's choirs from the various churches of the city under the direction of Gerald Conroy.

The Memorial Mass Committee extends an invitation to all people of the city and vicinity to attend the Memorial service.

Bishop Officiates At Final Tribute To Fr. Leo A. Smith

With a Solemn Pontifical Mass of Requiem offered by His Excellency, Bishop Kearney, final tribute was accorded to the Rev. Leo A. Smith in Immaculate Conception Church, Wednesday, May 27.

Father Smith, 39, chaplain of St. Mary's Boys' Home and St. Patrick's Girls' Home for the last two years, died Monday, May 25, 1942, after a long illness.

DEPLORES DESTRUCTION OF MALTA CHURCHES

LONDON.—Martyred Poland greeted suffering Malta in a message which General Sikorski sent to the Governor of the besieged island when news came that Britain's most Catholic colony had been awarded the George Cross for its heroic fortitude. General Sikorski wrote: "The ruins of Valletta and Maltese churches, just as the ruins of Poland, bear testimony to the love of freedom felt equally by Maltese and Poles. Our Christian ideals will be victorious over the pagan force. I congratulate you on the superb stand of all forces defending this important outpost of the Christian World."
