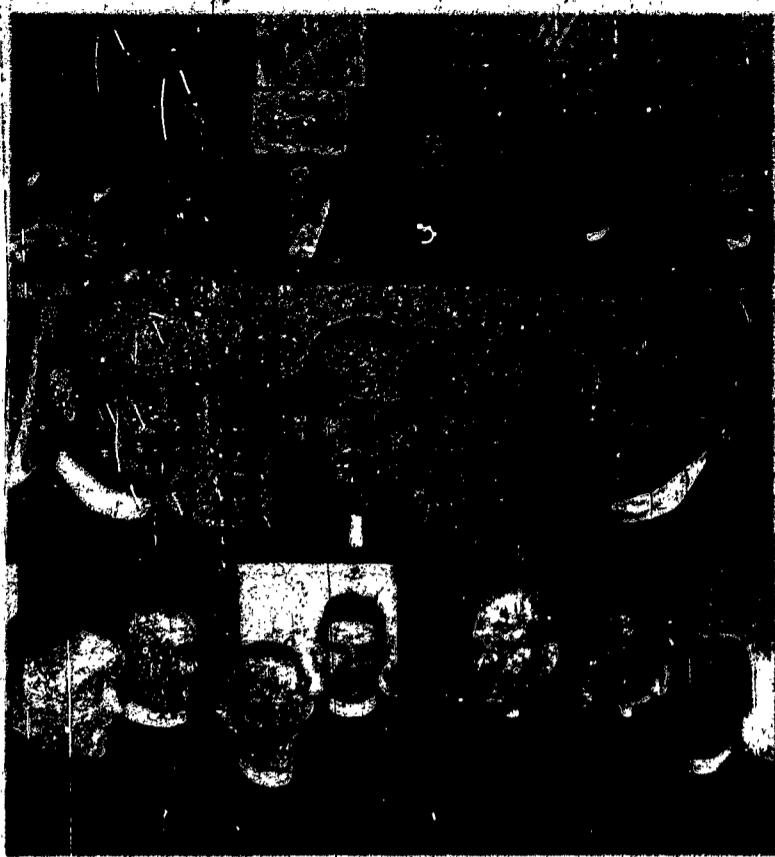
A report on the state convention last Thursday, Friday and Saturday at Lake Placid was given by Mr. Nugent.
