With relatives and friends included in the congregation that filled St. Mary's Church to capacity, the Rev. James F. Nolan, son of Mr. and Mrs. James F. Nolan of 226 Maple Ave. celebrated his first Solemn High Mass last Sunday.

Father Nolan had been ordained the previous day at St. Joseph's Cathedral in Buffalo by the Most Rev. John A. Duffy, Bishop of Buffalo.

The Rev. J. I. Moriarty, pastor of St. Mary's officiated as arch-priest. Other officiators were the Rev. Thomas J. Toole, Elmira Heights, deacon, and the Rev. Thomas G. Ryan, Richmond Hills, L. I. sub-deacon. A special musical program was given by the church choir, directed by Miss Loreta Ryan.

The Rev. Bernard C. Hanna, pastor of St. Anthony's Church, in his sermon spoke on the duties of a priest. "Great is the dignity of the office and divine is the power of the priesthood," he said.

Father Hanna declared that the ruler of a nation is bound by the spirit of the times and is chosen from men, ordained from men in things which pertain to men. On the other hand, the priest is taken from men and ordained for men in the things which pertain to God.

Following the Mass the clergy and members of the immediate family were guests at a dinner at the Mark Twain Hotel. A recep-

tion for the public was held at the Nolan home in the afternoon. Father Nolan will assume duties in the Diocese of St. Augustine, Fla. after a two-weeks' visit with his parents.

Members of the Sodality will receive Holy Communion at the 7:30 o'clock Mass. The breakfast will be served at 9 o'clock.

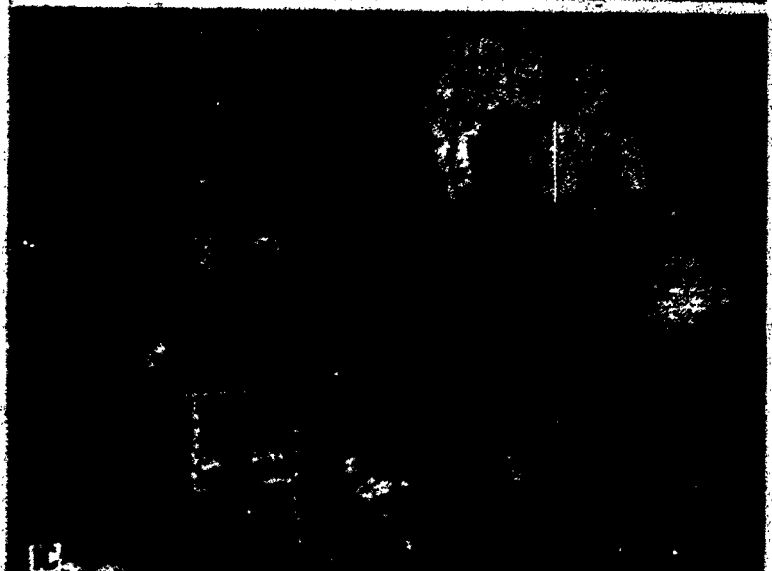
