3 Franciscans Return To Sing First High Mass

Three young men of the Franciscan Order, all from the Rochester Diocese, were ordained to the Holy Priesthood by the Most Rev. Joseph M. Corrigan, rector of the Catholic University at the National Shrine of the Immaculate Conception, May 28 and are singing their First Solemn Masses in their respective parish churches.

They are the Rev. Terence Conley, O.F.M., St. Andrew's parish, Rochester; the Rev. Bernardine Ward, O.F.M., St. Monica's, Rochester; and the Rev. Benedict Bernardi, O.F.M., St. Ann's Church, Hornell.

Father Terence will celebrate his First Solemn Mass, Sunday, June 14 at 11 A. M. in St. Andrew's Church, Portland Ave. The Rev. George W. Eckl, pastor will be Assistant Priest; the Rev. Brian Lhotz, O.F.M., St. Bonaventure's College, Deacon; the Rev. Bernardine Ward, O.F.M., Holy Name College, Washington, Subdeacon. The Rev. Valentine Long, O.F.M., St. Stephen's Friary, New York, will preach.

Father Bernardine will celebrate his First Solemn Mass on June 7 at 11 A. M. in St. Monica's Church, Genesee St. Deacon will be the Rev. Leonard Kelly, Chaplain, Nazareth College; Preacher, the Rev. Brendan Lyons, O.F.M., St. Francis Friary, Brookline, Mass.

Father Benedict offered his First Solemn Mass on May 31 at St. Ann's Church, Hornell, at 11 A. M.

Assistant Priest was the Rev. Andrew T. Diocetti, Deacon, the Rev. John O'Malley, Subdeacon, the Rev. James A. Schuck, O.F.M., St. Bonaventure College; Preacher, the Rev. Benjamin Kibler, O.F.M., Sloan College, Albany.

Father Terence, formerly known as Stephen Conley, attended St. Andrew's School and Aquinas Institute—after which he went to St. Andrew's Seminary.

Father Bernardine, formerly known as Joseph Ward, attended St. Monica's School, Aquinas Institute and St. Joseph's Seminary, Calhoun, N. Y.

Father Benedict, formerly known as Angelo Riccardo, attended St. Ann's School, Hornell, Hornell High School, and St. Joseph's Seminary, Calhoun, N. Y.

Fathers Terence, Bernardine and Benedict entered the novitiate of Franciscan Province of the Holy Name of Jesus in Paterson, N. J., in August, 1936. Upon completing the year there, they took their philosophical studies at St. Stephen's Friary, Croghan, N. Y., and St. Anthony's Friary, Butler, N. J. During the past three years they have studied Theology at Holy Name College in Washington, D. C. where they will return for another year.

Blood Bank At Nuns' Hospital Aids Injured In Sub Sinkings

NEW ORLEANS.—Blood plasma from the bank of Hotel Dieu, conducted here by the Daughters of Charity of St. Vincent de Paul, was used in treatment of seamen injured in the torpedoing of ships in the Gulf of Mexico. They were brought to the Marine Hospital here.

The plasma bank of Hotel Dieu is the only one in the city strictly for war purposes. It began operating only a month ago, but had built up to about 142 units, or quarts, when the first of the Gulf submarine attacks occurred.

CLYDE.—Word has been received by the Rev. Ralph Meyer, assistant pastor of St. John's Church, from Robert E. Ripley, famed cartoonist, that his contribution about Mrs. Rose Iocco who has walked to Mass every morning a distance of 10 miles, for the past twenty years, will appear in the famous cartoon about June 3, 1942.

Recessional: "Holy God," sung by the entire Congregation.

Members of the Rosary Society will receive Holy Communion in a body at the 8 o'clock Mass next Sunday.

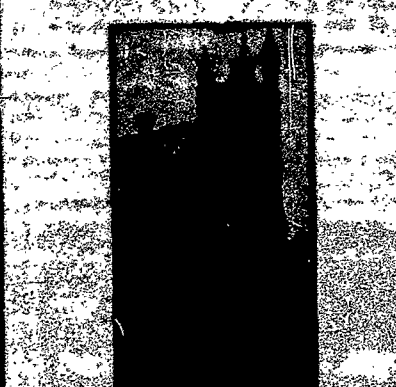
