Resolutions adopted at the meeting assailed Nazism, birth control and evil literature.

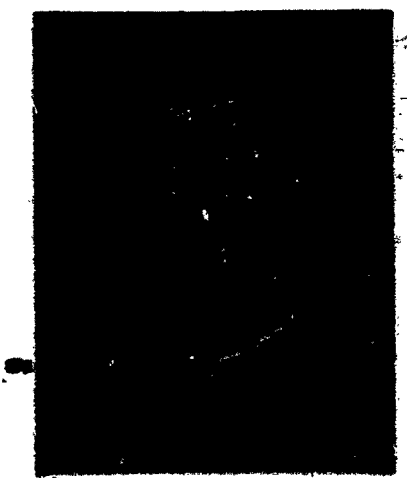

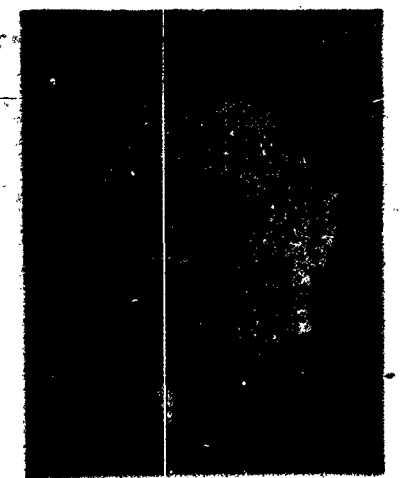

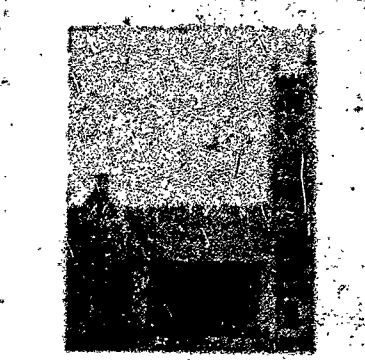
