NEWARK. The path along which a lay organization should travel in time of stress was outlined by Newark Council, Knights of Columbus, by Martin A. Moll, Jr. at the annual Communion breakfast, Sunday, May 19.

After receiving Holy Communion in St. Michael's Church the knights went to the Newark Country Club where Moll, a member of the Catholic Speakers Bureau sponsored by Rochester Council, Knights of Columbus, was presented by Grand Knight Richard Vickery.

The obligation of an organization such as the Knights of Columbus to perfect themselves during the period of emergency to be ready for the victory and peace "we want to endure" was set forth by the speaker. The organization, he said, should be in a better position to make even better contribution to state and nation at this time.

He urged making the Knights of Columbus more than a militant organization in words but to do it by action.

A good organization, Moll declared, should have high purpose, sound method of organization and fearless leadership.


