The following is the text of the joint pasteral letter.

Beloved Faithful:

For years a war has raged in our fatherland against Christianity and Church, and has never been conducted with such bitterness. Repeatedly the German Bishops have asked the Reich Covernment to discontinue this fatel struggle; but, unfortunately, our appeals, and en-deavors were without success.
