We regret to chronicle the death of Mrs. Teresa Ganster, Supreme President of the Ladies Auxiliaries of the Knights of St. John, on Thursday, June 4.

Mrs. Ganster has served as a member of the Board of Directors of the Rochester Diocesan Council, N.C.C.W. since its organization, first as Chairman of Organization and later as Parliamentarian.

Always interested in the work of the National Council of Catholic Women, she had been unflinching in her attendance at twenty national conventions.

Her illness this spring prevented her representing her National Organization at the 21st Convention of the N. C. C. W. in Hollywood, Florida.

In 1932 she was one of a group of five women of the Rochester Diocese honored by the conferring of the Papal decoration Pro Ecclesia et Pontifice.

We cannot estimate her loss to her own Auxiliaries, over which she presided for so many years, but she will be sadly missed at our local and diocesan N.C.C.W. meetings, both for her clear thinking, her courage in facing problems, and her unflinching cheerfulness.

At the request of our national president, Mrs. M. H. Keogh represented the National Board of Directors of the N.C.C.W. at the funeral June 8.

A delegation from the Board of Directors of the Rochester Diocesan Council attended the funeral Mass.
