Graduation Set Friday At New Nazareth

On the beautifully landscaped campus of the new Nazareth College, the Commencement Exercises of the college conducted by the Sisters of St. Joseph will be held for the first time at the East Ave. Pittsford, location, Friday, June 12, at 4 p. m.

His Excellency, the Most Rev. James E. Kearney, Bishop of Rochester will confer the degrees and awards.

The 1942 Commencement Address will be delivered by the Hon. Michael F. Walsh, Secretary of State of New York State and past state deputy of the Knights of Columbus who has been heard in this diocese on several previous occasions. He is a forceful and gifted speaker.

Commencement day will open with a Mothers' Luncheon to be given by the Senior class. Highlight of the evening will be the Senior Ball at the Sagamore Hotel.

The Commencement week program opened with the Baccalaureate ceremony on last Sunday when the 51 graduates and 500 guests assembled at the college to attend Pontifical Mass celebrated by Bishop Kearney.

Baccalaureate speaker The Rev John E. Daley, Ph.D., instructor at Most Holy Rosary High School, Syracuse in his Baccalaureate address declared that "in the name of academic freedom, the wildest fallacies have been sold to the unsuspecting, while freedom itself has been used as a cover to undermine freedom."

Father Daley declared that "for 50 years public education has been the child of predilection in this country."

"The findings of the Rapp-Corderi Committee in Albany have awakened us to the fact that we have been nursing at public expense too many cuckoos who would, if given the chance, turn us out of our nests."

"Small wonder, then, that there is confusion when so many peacocks, and pink ones at that, have been guiding American youth. Perhaps too late will America learn with chagrin that 'all men are vain in whom there is not the knowledge of God.'"

"The truth is that religion must form the basis of any education and that education with religion omitted isn't really education at all. In secular schools on every level, creatures are studied in all detail and from every phase, but the Creator must not even be mentioned."

"All the fables of mythology can be discussed at great length and all the villains of history given prominence, but the life of Jesus Christ, the central figure of all ages, is assiduously ignored."

And to the graduates Father Daley pointed out that "your degree from Nazareth is a commission to a high post. Right now you are the 'salt of the earth.' You have it in your power to dedicate your learning and talents to the advancement of God's interests or to squander them on selfish pursuits."

At the conclusion of the ceremonies the seniors placed roses at the altar of the Blessed Virgin, and the student body of 250 sang the Ave Maria.

Scotland Yard Wars On Obscene Books

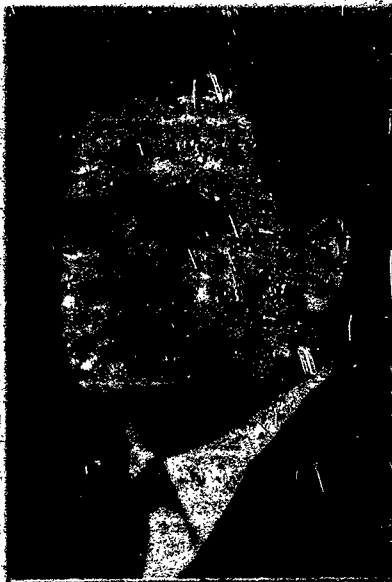
LONDON (NC) Scotland Yard will intensify its drive against obscene literature here, it is believed following the conviction at the Old Bailey of two firms of publishers and two authors on charges relating to the publication of three books. Together they were fined \$2,000 and paid \$550 costs.

The authors were ordered to be kept in custody until the fines were paid.

It is believed that these cases will have a salutary effect on publishing here. The books concerned were not the only, and perhaps not the worst, offenders against the standards of decency which many people hold. Some west-end book shops carry large stocks of lurid books, cheaply produced and highly priced, to meet the general loosening of morals which is a phenomenon of wartime.

Both the publishing firms concerned in the recent prosecution are businesses of good repute.

Mothers Ask Probe of Birth Rate Decline

LONDON. — (NC) — Liverpool mothers, members of the Catholic Union of Mothers, call for the appointment of a Government commission to inquire into the decline of the birth rate, thus developing studies already begun by private organizations.

At a meeting of the Liverpool archdiocesan board of the union it was pointed out that many modern senior schools, "conceived with high hope and a generosity of vision," have only 15 per cent of the pupils they could contain. "The children are not there to fill them," said one speaker.

Another speaker regretted that while contraceptives are readily available today, many articles necessary to sustain health are in short supply.
