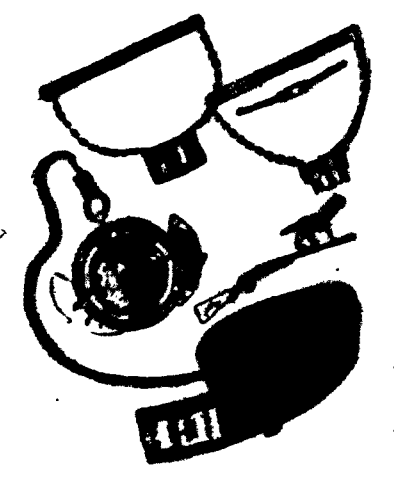

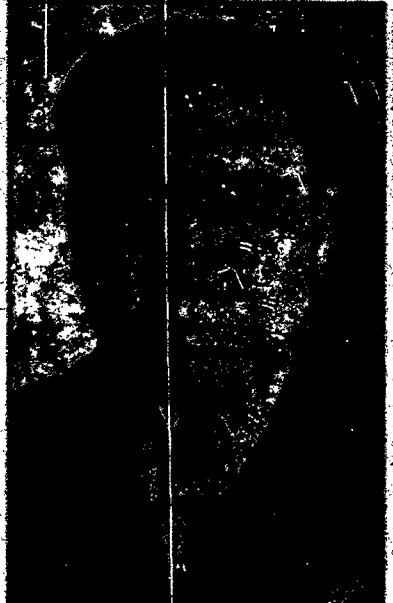

On May the twenty-fifth it pleas'd the Lord to take from us one whom we loved in life and are loath to forget in death. The bright smile and cheerful countenance which brought an increase of joy and happiness to the sick, the orphan and the man on the busy street are no longer with us but the memory of them remains as a holy benediction.

If there was one characteristic that stood out in the life of Father Smith, it was the spirit of charity and helpfulness which he brought to all with whom he came in contact; a reflection, it would seem, of that "Spirit of The Lord which fills The Whole Earth."

As a member of Christ's Eternal Priesthood, endowed with power over the Real and Mystical Body of Christ, in the celebration of Holy Mass and in exercising the power of forgiveness of sin in the sacrament of penance, Fr. Smith assuredly must have been, under God, the means of bringing peace and comfort and an increase of Divine Grace to thousands of God's children. Only in eternity will we fully realize the good that is wrought by the ministrations of a priest of God, even in the space of a few short years.

A constant habit of always looking on the brighter side of life, the ability to smile at the juxtaposition of the incongruous in human affairs made Father Smith, "One of Nature's Noblemen" and a source of joy to his associates and countless friends. Surely the God of nature who so generously endowed him with these gifts in the natural order, intended that they should be used to cheer and encourage his fellow travellers on the road to eternity.

The spirit of courage and resignation which this priest manifested in his last, long and trying illness is a further indication of the greatness of soul which was his. His translation from this life to a brighter and a better world leaves a void, an emptiness and a sense of loss which will be long and keenly felt by those who knew him and benefited by his ministrations.

"The Lord Gave, and The Lord Hath Taken Away; As It Hath Pleas'd The Lord So It Is Done: Blessed Be The Name Of The Lord." Farewell then Dear Friend, Companion of many youthful joys, and sharer in the crosses of our common ministry! No, Not Farewell but "Au Revoir," "Until We Meet Again" in the Land of The Living; where there shall be no more sickness, no more sorrow, no more death, where there is no need of the sun for, "God Is The Light Thereof," where, Please God, united again we shall "Sing Forever The Mercies Of The Lord."

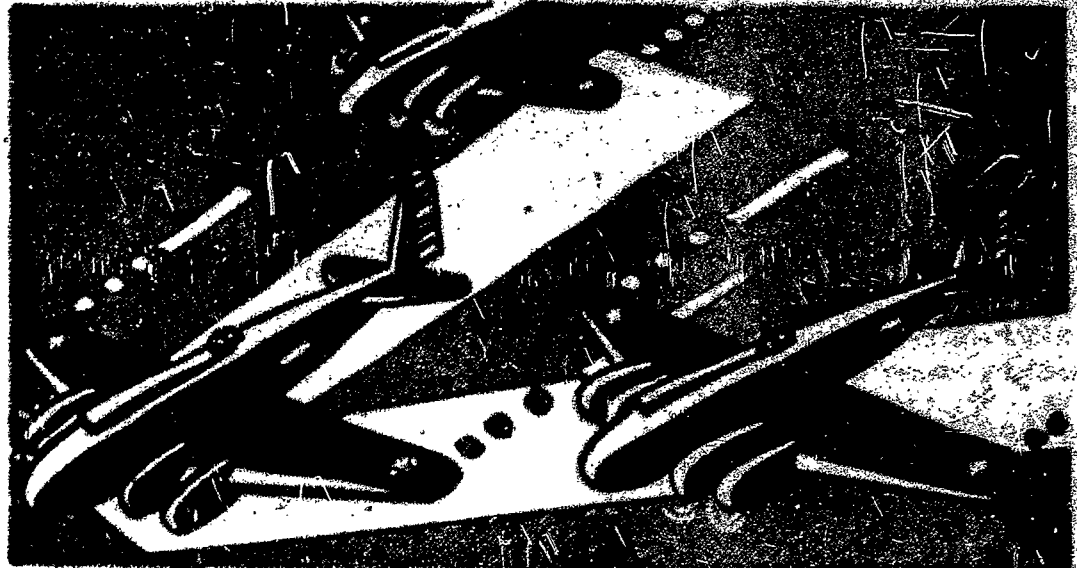
Reprint Starts
