LATROBE, Pa. — The Rev. Fintan Shaniker, O.S.B., son of Mr. and Mrs. Shaniker of 121 Edgeland St., Rochester, N. Y., will be among the 33 young men to be ordained by the Rt. Rev. Hugh C. Boyle, D.D., Bishop of Pittsburgh on June 14, at St. Vincent Archabbey in Latrobe, Pa. Father Fintan attended St. Andrew's Prep and St. Joseph Seminary before his entrance to St. Vincent College. He entered the Novitiate of the Benedictine Order in 1935, and a year later took vows. While at the college he earned his degrees of Bachelor of Arts and Master of Arts. He has done post graduate work at Notre Dame, and Rosary College. He is a member of the Catholic Library Association and is engaged as assistant College Librarian. He also belongs to the Special Libraries Association, the Pittsburgh Unit of the Catholic Library Association; Pittsburgh Chapter, Special Libraries Association; he is chairman of the College and University Committee of the Pittsburgh Chapter of the Catholic Library Association. He is also a member of the St. Bernard Literary Society, moderator of the Pius XI Library Guild; teaches English in the Prep, and lectures on Bibliographical Orientation.

Father Fintan will read his First Mass on June 21 at Corpus Christi Church in Rochester. The Rt. Rev. Msgr. William M. Hart, V.G., will be assistant priest. The Rev. Matthew Cuddy, O.P. will be Deacon, and the Rev. Xavier Mibun, O.S.B., will be Subdeacon. The Rt. Rev. Archabbot Alfred Koch, O.S.B., will preach the sermon. The Master of Ceremonies will be the Rev. Vincent Lefrois, O.S.B.

St. Agnes High School prepares its pupils under the direction of the State Regents Board for graduation with a diploma of the same grade granted by other Catholic High Schools. Early registration is recommended for candidates for the September term.

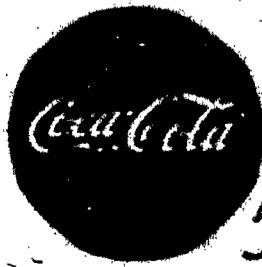
