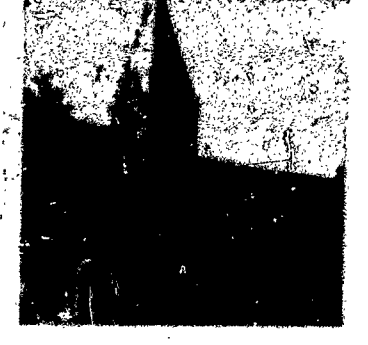

First Weekend Retreat Opens At Geneva, June 26

Marking the actual opening of weekend retreats for laymen in the Diocese of Rochester, the schedule for these retreats at Our Lady of the Lake Retreat House formally opened by His Excellency, Bishop Kearney, on May 30, at Geneva, is released, this week.

The first weekend retreat on Friday, Saturday and Sunday June 26, 27 and 28, will be made by Past Officers of the Rochester Laymen's Retreat League and pioneer Retreatants in this diocese. The complete schedule is announced today by the Rev. John P. Murphy, C.S.S.R., director of the Retreat House.

Capacity of the new Retreat House in Geneva which has been highly praised by all who have inspected it, is 40 men. Father Murphy, the Redemptorist Father in charge announces that all reservations should be made a week in advance, if possible. Retreatants should be present for supper on the Friday opening their particular retreat at 7 P. M. The retreat exercises begin at 8 P. M. on Friday and close on Sunday afternoon.

How Priest Said Mass In 3 Countries In As Many Days Recalled

LONDON. (NC) The celebration of Mass by the Most Rev. Charles L. Nelligan, Bishop of Pembroke, Canada, and Bishop Ordinary to the Canadian Forces, in Canada one day and in Great Britain the next day recalls a similar incident in 1930. Bishop Nelligan made the journey to England back by plane.

Two weeks after the present war broke out, the Rev. Edward Leen, C.S.S.P., of the Holy Ghost Missionary College in Dublin, celebrated Mass Saturday morning in New York, on Sunday morning he offered the Holy Sacrament in Shediac, N.B., Canada and said another Mass at Foynes, Ireland, on Monday morning. Father Leen made the Atlantic crossing in a Dixie Clipper.
