## Asks Safeguards For Women

**MONTREAL.**—The Federation of Leagues of the Sacred Heart, which has a membership of more than 100,000 men, most of whom are fathers of families, has asked that:

In all work available men should not be accepted for night work unless it is shown that the work entails their physical strength, age, and present or future role as mothers.

Women be not accepted for night work except in cases of extreme necessity, and mothers never.

Mothers of young children not be admitted to manual work unless by

special Government permit which should not exceed such period as is shown the physical and mental adequate care of their own personal well-being of the child.


