

Fr. Dailey Offers First Solemn Mass In Corning

"For he would have us rejoice with him today because he has been called to be a mediator between God and man... for in his elevation to the dignity of a priest he becomes another golden link in the timeless chain that binds men to their Almighty Creator."

God Inhaled Eternity

Father Mahoney told the congregation that God Himself, recognizing the need of the human race for a mediator between Him and it, instituted the Jewish priesthood. He ordered that Aaron and the tribe of Levi be set apart from the others and He surrounded the priesthood with a beautiful ceremonial and He reminded the tribe that they were "to be in the land but not of it."

"For three years," said Father Mahoney "His first priests were set apart in the intimacy of His Divine company to be schooled in the fundamental law of the New Dispensation, the love of God and the love of neighbor. And in that last solemn act before His death He instituted the New and Eternal Priesthood that was to endure forever when after changing the bread and wine into His Body and Blood He said 'Do this for a commemoration of Me' And it was likewise on that evening that He told them that they were now set apart that they were to be in the world but not of it and then he uttered those words that have ever been so dear to the heart of every priest 'I will no longer call you servants because I will call you friends. You have not chosen Me but I have chosen you that you should go forth and bear fruit and that your fruit should remain'"

Joyous Words

"How clearly my friends did St. Paul give expression to the sacrificial character of this New and Eternal Priesthood when he said 'I received of the Lord that which I delivered unto you, that the Lord Jesus on the same night on which He was betrayed took bread and giving thanks said Take you and eat this is MY Body which shall be delivered for you and in like manner the chalice saying This chalice is the New Testament in My Blood, so often as you shall eat this bread and drink this chalice you shall shew the death of the Lord until He come."

"And so my friends the greatest happiness that comes to the heart of a priest this morning is because he can say these words that he has desired to speak for so long a time 'What shall I render to the Lord for all the things that He has rendered unto me? I shall take the chalice of salvation and call upon the name of the Lord and I will go unto the altar of God to God who giveth joy to my youth..."

Then Father Mahoney reminded his hearers that God, in His message to the Apostles four times repeated the word "all." "All Power is given to Me going make disciples of All nations. All things that I have commanded you and behold I am with you All days." It was these words, spoken with conviction and authority by Jesus Christ that gave courage to the early martyrs and singleness of purpose to the priests of future centuries when they fulfilled Christ's command to carry the gospel to the whole world, Father Mahoney said.

"Today," said the speaker "there is not the smallest section of the inhabited globe that is not under the spiritual direction of some parish priest."

Universal Doctrine

"How beautiful is the harmony and unity of this doctrine today as it comes from the lips of the priest the same in every country and in every time. And if he speaks with a manifestation of a greater sincerity and with a stronger and more firm conviction, it is because he speaks not his own opinion, not a doctrine of his own origin, but because he speaks with the authority and name of Jesus Christ. He preaches the doctrine of Jesus Christ and Him crucified."

Father Mahoney continued: "The third great power which the priest possesses is that of the forgiveness of sin. How singularly does the priestly office reflect the beautiful mercy and the loving kindness of Almighty God. Indeed it would seem almost difficult to acknowledge the infinite mercy and the infinite kindness of God if He had not exhibited this tremendous power from His priesthood."

"All thinking men will acknowledge that no more misery and unhappiness can come to the human heart than that which arises from the consciousness of sin. Men will

suffer the loss of wealth and possessions. They will lose through death members of their family and beloved friends. But as the poet says 'Hope springs eternal' and God has mercifully directed that the healing hand of time close over the wounds of mental earthly suffering. But it is not so with the loss of personal integrity. For the heart weighed down with the consciousness of sin nothing can compensate. This same Divine person who so conclusively proved to the unbelieving that He had the power to forgive sin transmitted that power to his priests forever on that solemn occasion just as He was about to leave this earth. Then He declared to them 'Whose sins you shall forgive they are forgiven them whose sins you shall retain they are retained.'

"Thus it is given to the hand of the priest to teach up beyond the horizon of the sky and with the golden key unlock the treasure of God's mercy and compassion applying them to the souls of men."

First Blessing

"There is something very beautiful in the innocence of the young priest newly ordained. For many years the church has carefully guarded his youthful virtue, setting him apart from the world, surrounding him with all the spiritual safeguards that she can muster. Having vowed in solemn promise his service to God and fellowman, he comes forth from the ordination ceremony with a heart full of zeal for the cause of Christ. That is why tradition and custom move Catholic people to seek eagerly the blessing of the newly ordained because it is felt that he is treasured in the sight of God."

"As this young priest raises his hand to bless you this morning I trust that you will utter a silent prayer that God will preserve for him that spirit of prayer, the holiness, that is his today."

"Father Dailey, in welcoming you into the priesthood, in the name of your brother priests I utter their sincere wishes and mine that Jesus Christ will ever keep you close to Him in the intimacy of the Eucharist. God Bless you Father Dailey ad multos annos Amen."

Ain at Altar Rail

Following Mass, hundreds of persons of all creeds sought Father Dailey's blessing at the altar rail. At 3 P. M. a dinner was served at the Baron Steuben Hotel, honoring the new priest. Serving as toastmaster, the Rev. John A. Smith called upon Mr. Griffin, the Rev. Joseph Quillford, pastor of St. Vincent de Paul's Church; Father Kane, a former classmate of Father Dailey; Father Mahoney; the Rev. Maurus A. Kennedy, O.F.M., all of whom gave brief talks.

The Benediction was given by Father Dailey.

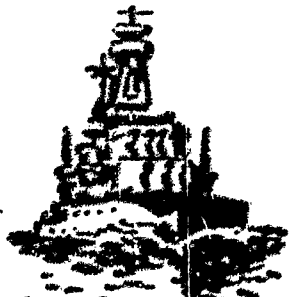
Aged Brother Has Carried College's Mail Four Times Around World in 42 Years
