Seeks Members For Scapular Militia

Five hundred thousand Scapulars for the service men is the first objective of the newly organized "Scapular Militia," sponsored by the American Carmelite Fathers of the New York Province. These Scapulars will be distributed to the men gratis through their military chaplains.

At this same time there will be given to each man a Scapular Medal and a leaflet explaining Mary's Scapular Promise - "Who dies in this Scapular will not suffer eternal fire," and her Sabbotens Privilege, "I, the Mother of Graces, shall descend on the Saturday after their death, and as many as I shall find in Purgatory, I shall free."

For those who wish to help in this new, large-scale program occasioned by the National War Effort, there are three degrees of membership:

The First Degree includes all those who help sew the cloth Scapulars, the materials and instructions having been obtained from the National Office of the Militia.

The Second Degree embraces all those who give one dollar or more to aid in the purchase of material, folders, medals and in the cost of distribution.

The Third Degree is a combination of the other two. It includes all those who assist by donating funds, and by sewing cloth scapulars.

The First and Second Degree Members are remembered in Saturday Masses for one year, and the Third Degree Members are remembered in the Saturday Masses for a period of two years. The faithful departed enrolled in the Second Degree also become members of the Carmelite Purgatorial Society and are remembered in an additional 230 Masses throughout the year.

The Scapular Militia, with its motto of "A Scapular and Medal for Every Catholic Service Man" has already received the approval of His Excellency, the Most Rev. John F. O'Hara, C.S.C.
