NEW YORK.—Confiscation of church bells by the Nazis has been going on in Czechoslovakia since early April and has given rise to riots and protest demonstrations in many places, according to the Czechoslovak Press Bureau here. Reports reaching Czech circles in London, the Bureau said, state that the confiscation of church bells is being carried on through soldiers and the local authorities. The bells are immediately sent to armament factories where they are melted and the metal used for the manufacture of heavy guns.

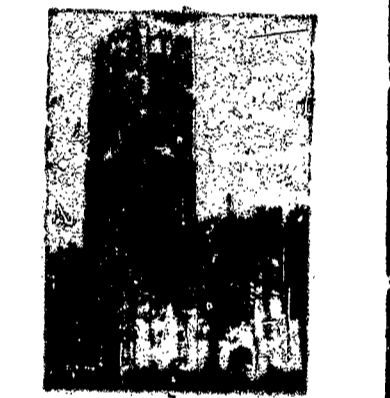

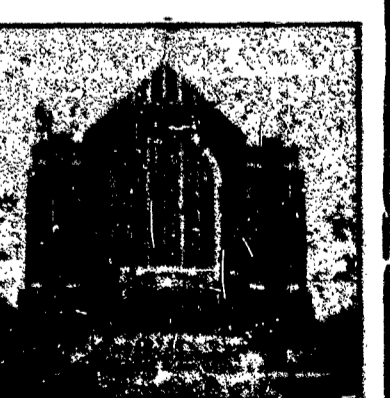
